By-election to Bhola-3 constituency is likely to be held on April 24, Election Commissioner Muhammad Sohul Hussein said yesterday.

"We are considering April 24 as the Higher Secondary Certificate examinations start early next month," he said after an Election Commission (EC) meeting.

the final voter list of Bhola-3 constituency, which includes Lalmohon and Tojimuddin upazilas. The number of voters of the constituency is 2.20 lakh. Earlier on February 3, the EC

declared Bhola-3 parliamentary constituency vacant following a Supreme Court verdict.

AL candidate Maj (retd) Jasim Uddin was elected from this constituency in December 29 parliamentary polls. But the SC declared his candidacy illegal as he contested the polls within five years of his retirement from the defence service.

Global demand for jute on rise while growers face problems

Jute growers of the country are beset with a flurry of production and marketingrelated problems at a time when global demand for the natural fibre is on the rise.

Farmers and experts at a workshop on jute held in the city yesterday echoed the same concerns that if the country misses out the opportunity of tapping current favourable export market for jute due to these nagging problems, its economy will be ultimate looser in the long run.

They listed the problems

like crises of quality jute seeds, adulteration in fertiliser and pesticides, problem in rotting jute due to water scarcity and profit mongering of middlemen.

Traidcraft Exchange and TARANGO, two nongovernment organisations with special focus on jute promotion, organised the workshop at IDB Bhaban to raise awareness of jute and formally launch their fiveyear 'Golden Fibre' project involving 3,500 beneficiaries of four predominantly jute-growing upazilas in Faridpur and Gopalganj.

Addressing the work-

shop, Director General of Bangladesh Jute Research Institute (BJRI) Dr Kamal Uddin laid special emphasis on becoming selfsufficient in meeting up the country's total jute seed requirements and urged

people to increase domes-

like India. KR Hasan, Executive Director of Jute Diversification Promotion Centre (JDPC) under the jute ministry, called on the jute growers to form cooperatives and go for collective jute production system doing away with the frag-

mented jute tilling lands in the countryside.

Two farmers' representatives, who spoke at the workshop, made special pleas to break the unholy nexus of agriculture extension staffs and adulterers in seeds, fertiliser and pestitic usage of jute products cides.
