

Food inflation up

Reaches double-digit after 15 months

The country's food inflation reached as high as 10.56 percent in January this year on a point-topoint basis, crossing the double-digit mark again after 15 months. In September 2008 it was 12.02 percent.

The inflation was even higher in urban areas in January this year, reaching 12.07 percent.

Non-food inflation at the national level however dropped slightly in January this year standing at 6.53 percent compared to December last year's 7.04.

The countrywide overall inflation increased by .48 percentage point reaching 8.99 percent in January this year, which was 8.51 percent in

December last.

Between October 2008 and June 2009 overall inflation kept falling, dropping to 2.3 percent in June. But from July last year both food and nonfood inflation regained their upward trends, increasing every month.

The data came out of the half-yearly report on the implementation of the current annual budget, submitted to the parliament by Finance Minister AMA Muhith on Tuesday.

Under the impacts of price hikes on the international market, and due to increases in remittance flow and foreign currency reserves, the inflation showed an upward trend, he said adding that the government already put several

Innocent sued for saving Jubo League men

Detective Branch of police in Bogra has implicated a young man in a "false case" to save Jubo League cadres involved in a shooting at Malgram Dighipara in the town last December.

Md Ibrahim Hossain Kunu, vice president of ward no 14 Jubo League, told The Daily Star that a gang of seven to eight miscreants, including Jubo League cadre Mostakim, in three motorcycles shot five to six rounds at him on December 7 to grab a disputed land. He jumped into a nearby pond to save his life.

Kunu said he informed the high police officials in Bogra of the matter and told them that Jubo League cadres Mostakim, Roman and Adil were among those who shot him but police did not take any case from him.

He also said DB Sub-Inspector Lutfor Rahman filed a case and arrested Belal, 24, son of tea vendor Ramzan, from Khandar Bazar on December 11 afternoon.

Kunu said police also took Belal to a graveyard at the bazar and a revolver was reportedly recovered from there.

Talking to The Daily Star on Sunday SI Lutfor admitted that he was compelled to file the "false case" against Belal to save the Jubo League cadres following orders from high police officials. Police have already submitted charge sheet of the case. SI Lutfor declined to comment.

ASP (Circle-A) Arifur Rahman Mondal of the district said Mostakim was one of the criminals who shot at Kunu. He, however, could not say why police did not press charge against the
