# Law, order slide in Rajshahi city for laxity of police

Law and order situation has been worsening in Rajshahi city, as extortionists, drug peddlers and muggers have become very active in many localities due to lax monitoring of the law enforcers.

At least three to five murders are committed every month since January this year, said police officials.

City dwellers said muggings and extortions have become regular phenomena with maximum incidents leaving beyond the police record.

Law enforcers are apparently finding it difficult to cope with the situation as, they said, the recent violent incidents on the campuses are eating up much of their time and forces.

Talking to The Daily Star, Rajshahi Metropolitan Police (RMP) Commissioner Nawsher Ali, however, claimed that the law and order situation here is still good.

"The incidents occurring are separate ones. We are trying to ensure speedy investigation into the incidents."

Muggers in Rajshahi city started to

On Thursday, the muggers posing as detective branch policemen snatched away Tk 15 lakh and the licenced revolver of Osman Gani, a businessman of Dhaka, and two of the his relatives at Kapasia under Motihar Police Station.

The hawkers at Laxmipur alleged that policemen, led by Afzal Hossain, officerin-charge (OC) of Rajpara Police Station, on Wednesday night vandalised some 20 roadside shops, damaged goods on plea of evicting them.

Some 10 people were injured in a clash with the law enforcers.

Businessmen, including Muhammad Chand and Al Amin, alleged that local police were taking Tk 10 as toll from them every day, but they launched the eviction drive when the traders denied paying them a new demand for Tk 3,000 per month.

However, the OC denied the allegations and said the drive was launched following directives of the government high-ups.

In the evening of March 15, assailants murdered Raju Ahmed, a teenager, just

become so daring that they did not spare beside New Market police outpost.

The victim's family members said Raju could not live even after going to Rajshahi city from Bagmara for security of his life.

They alleged that local police persecuted Raju's family centring a dispute with local influential people over land and extortion.

The police could hardly make any headway into the killing.

Drug peddling is another menace, which worries people in some areas, particularly Binodpur, Kajla, Dasmari, Dharampur, Meherchandi, Budpara, Assam Colony, Fire Brigade crossing and Bulonpur.

Peddlers have built their strongholds even around the offices of RMP and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab)-5.

The areas have become safe havens for drug peddlers with around one lakh bottles of smuggled Phensidyl pouring into the city daily.

The drug peddlers having a nexus with the ruling party men have laid siege to Motihar Police Station thrice since January for arresting their members.

### **BHOLA-3 BY-POLLS** Hafiz wants deployment of army

BNP Vice Chairman Maj (retd) Hafizuddin Ahmed yesterday urged the Election Commission (EC) to deploy army for the Bhola-3 by-election.

He deems army deployment necessary to ensure the election is free and fair, and also in providing a secure atmosphere for the vacated Barisal division constituency that represents a chance for the BNP to gain one seat on the government's overwhelming majority in parliament.

He also demanded that international observers to be invited to monitor the contest, which is scheduled to be held on April 24.

Hafiz, who lost the seat in the last general elections in December 2008, made these demands during a press briefing at his Dhaka residence vesterday afternoon.

According to the former minister, ruling party cadres and goons have stoked a situation of panic in the constituency ahead of the election.

Welcoming the by-election schedule, Hafiz expressed his confidence in the EC. "If the EC fulfils its role properly, the ruling party's ill-attempts will not succeed," he said.

He also said he hopes that the EC will take appropriate punitive action against the local administration in the constituency, if they are found to be playing a biased role to influence the election.

On February 3, the EC declared the Bhola-3 parliamentary constituency, which covers the Lalmohan and Tajumuddin upazilas, vacant following a Supreme Court verdict.

# Bangladeshi set to start expedition to Everest

MA Muhit, a Bangladeshi and a member of Bangladesh Mountaineering and Trekking Club (BMTC), is set to start an expedition to the Mount Everest next month.

If he can make it, Muhit will be the first Bangladeshi to conquer the Everest, the 8850metre (29,035ft) giant lying across the Nepal-Tibet border.

This was told at a press conference and flag off ceremony at the National Press Club in the city yesterday.

Muhit gave a presentation on the Everest at the press conference where he said a team comprising seven members (six others of Germany and the USA) would leave Dhaka for the 60-day expedition on April 6. Muhit is the only Bangladeshi to conquer
