#### Boy killed in Keraniganj clash

A teenage boy was killed and six others were injured in a clash between two groups of villagers over a trifling matter at Baghna village in Keraniganj yesterday.

The boy was identified as Babar Hossain alias Babu, 18, son of Badsha Mia at West Subadda in South Keraniganj.

The police and witnesses said an adolescent boy, Rana, was locked in an altercation with a woman on Friday evening after a ball hit her when the boy was playing cricket with his friends.

As a sequel to the incident, relatives of both Rana and the woman attacked each other with lethal weapons at about 11:00am, leaving six people, including Babu, injured.

### 12,000 rotten eggs seized, 2 held in Ctg

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday seized some 12,000 rotten eggs brought here for selling at different bakeries and arrested two people in this connection.

Rab officials said the rotten eggs, which were brought to the port city to sell those to different bakeries, are regularly used in preparing food items.

Acting on a tip-off, a team

of Rab-7 raided the city's Pahartali area in the afternoon and seized a truck loaded with the eggs. They arrested one Mojaher

Ahmad, 50, of the area while he was unloading the eggs from the vehicle.

According to his information, the elite crime busters raided a godown adjacent to Pahartali Police Station and arrested its owner Abdul Matin, 32, of Langalkot of Comilla.

Maj Md Sabbir said both the arrestees confessed that they used to buy those rotten eggs at cheaper rate from different poultry farms of Dhaka, Gazipur and Savar and deliver those to different local bakeries.

They also confessed that they used to deliver around 20,000 rotten eggs to different local bakeries in a week, he added.

The arrestees were handed over to Pahartali police.

#### All necessary steps taken to start war crimes trial Says law minister

Law Minister Shafique Ahmed yesterday visited the old High Court building where a tribunal will be set up for holding trial of 1971 war criminals.

During his visit, he told The Daily Star that the government has arranged almost all necessary logistics, including venue and relevant offices, to start the process of the longawaited war crimes trial.

He said the government will appoint a six-member investigation agency, and a 12member prosecution team and form a three-member tribunal before March 26 to start the process.

The people, who committed crimes against the humanity during the country's liberation war in 1971, will be put into trial, he added.

The minister further said that the government will hold the trial maintaining international standards so that there remains no confusion about it.

#### Int'l workshop on counterterrorism begins today

A five-day international workshop on 'Counter-Terrorism Capacity Building' begins at Hotel Sheraton in the city under the auspices of Bangladesh Institute of Peace and Security Studies today.



Researchers at the University of Manchester's School of Environment and Development have been awarded £500,000 to study poverty and climate change in Bangladesh.

The project funded by the Economic and Social Research Council and the Department for International Development for over three years will bring together a team of leading Bangladeshi and UK researchers and policy activists.

The programme will work with the Brac Development Institute at Brac University along with other leading research agencies in Bangladesh, Manchester University sources said.

The Brooks World Poverty Institute team of Dr Manoj Roy and Prof David Hulme along with Prof Simon Guy form the Manchester Architecture Research Centre will examine how the urban poor in Bangladesh are responding to the increasingly dire effects of global warming.

Prof Simon Guy said: "The project responds directly to three of the grand challenges facing society globally -- poverty, rapid urbanisation and climate change."


