A Dhaka court yesterday issued an arrest warrant against Opposition Chief Whip Zainul Abdin Farroque hours after a case was filed against him for making "derogatory remarks" about prime minister's son SajeebWazed Joy.

Metropolitan Magistrate Mehedi Hassan Talukder passed the order after advocate Moshiur Malek, president of Bangabandhu Foundation, filed the case.

New info highway to link neighbours

Ecnec okays project to connect India, Nepal, Bhutan; rural e-centres to generate new jobs

The government's vision of a "digital Bangladesh" came a step nearer yesterday when the Executive Committee on National Economic Council approved a Tk 29 crore project to establish an information highway with India, Nepal and Bhutan.

Fifty-five kilometres of fibre optic cables will be installed between Panchgarh and Banglabandha and a landing station will be built in Panchgarh, which will provide a rural wireless broadband network and portal service.

Five or six community e-centres will also be established, which are expected to stimulate job growth and income in rural

The project is titled "Establishment of South Asia Sub-regional Economic Cooperation Information Highway (Bangladesh Part)" and it is scheduled to begin in July and to be completed by December

It's all for a few bottles of water

A row over some stolen bottles of drinking water led to the double murder at the counter of Soudia S Alam Paribahan in the city's Arambagh on March 16, said two arrestees yesterday.

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-3) arrested two employees of Soudia S Alam Paribahan-- peon Mohammad Ahsan Ullah Robin, 18, and bus helper Mohammad Sohel, 25, on Monday from in front of Rajdhani Supermarket and Janapath intersection respectively.

The victims were Abu Sufian, 40, a mobile phone accessories trader at Sundarban Square Market in the city's Fulbaria, and Ilias Kanchan Payel, 18, an employee of Soudia S Alam Paribahan. Al-amin, another killer who is still at large, brought bottles of

drinking water from Chittagong. He was to distribute them to different counters of Soudia S Alam Paribahan, Sohel and Robin told reporters at the Rab-3 headquarters.

Ilias stole some of them. Al-amin asked Ilias to return the bottles. As Ilias refused to return them Al-amin got enraged, they said.

At one stage Al-amin sought our help, Sohel told The Daily Star, adding: "We three then went to the counter at about 1:00 am where Ilias and Sufian along with five to six other passengers were inside the counter."

ACC explains its view on freedom

Urges law minister to protect it

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday requested the law minister to consider its opinion before any decision is taken on the proposed amendments to the ACC Act.

"We have apprised the law minister of our views and opinions regarding amendments to the ACC Act 2004. We requested the minister to discuss our views at the cabinet meeting while reviewing the amendments proposed by the governmentformed committee," ACC Chairman Ghulam Rahman told The Daily Star.

Ghulam Rahman along with two ACC commissioners-- Abul Hasan Manjur Masud and Habibur Rahman -- made the request at a meeting with Law Minister Shafique Ahmed at his office.

They met him as the government-formed committee to review the ACC Act finalised its report ignoring the anti-graft body's reservations on some of the amendment proposals.

Earlier, the ACC had expressed its reservations on six of the 23 amendments proposed by the committee formed in March last The commission explained to the law minister that these

amendments would diminish its independence, sources said. The minister however assured the ACC that the government

would amend the Act only to ensure that the anti-graft body functions neutrally and independently.

"The commission will now function for eradication of corruption. The cabinet will decide on amendments to the ACC Act after considering the views and opinions of the commission, and recommendations made by the government-constituted committee to update the Act," Shafique told journalists after the meeting. "But the commission has to work within a legal framework
