Govt to phase out PSI system

Muhith speaks at AmCham meeting

Finance Minister AMA Muhith said yesterday the existing pre-shipment inspection (PSI) system for imported goods would be substituted by a new system in the cus-

He said it is not yet decided whether the government will withdraw the proposed mandatory PSI system for nearly 1,800 products, to phase it out from the next fiscal year.

"Our idea is that we will not have the PSI system in future. A new system will be in place in future," Muhith told the regular monthly luncheon meeting of the American Chamber of Commerce (AmCham) in Bangladesh at Dhaka Sheraton

Delivering his speech on the Future Economic Outlook for Bangladesh', Muhith said dependency on textiles will be reduced and ICT will be the second largest exporting sector for Bangladesh by

Businessmen seek safeguard for industrial sector

Businessmen from different sectors yesterday asked Industries Minister Dilip Barua to bravely deal with the finance ministry to protect the interests of the industrial sector in the upcoming national budget.

They also asked the minister to form a core group, involving businessmen, to help the ministry guide development of the industries, especially the private sector.

Businessmen made these suggestions, as they have never seen an industries minister deal proactively with a finance minister in safeguarding local interests.

The observation came at a discussion on the aspirations of the industrial sector on tariff and non-tariff structures in the coming budget to be placed in parliament in June.

"The industries minister should have the guts to protect the interests of the local industries," said Gazi Golam Dastagir, a ruling party lawmaker and a leading businessman.

He said multilateral lenders, such as the World Bank, always push the government to reduce duties for the import of finished goods and increase it for raw materials.

Golam Dastagir said businessmen were able to manage the finance minister to reduce import duties for raw materials by 2 percentage points to 5 percent last year.

"Keep an eye on any move by vested quarters to raise duty on raw materials and reduce it for finished items," he urged businessmen.

Abdur Razzak, president of Bangladesh Engineering Industries Owners Association, said the gap in duties between finished goods and raw materials should increase further to help local industries flourish.

Businessmen said there will be no industrialisation without improvement of infrastructure, particularly energy and power.

They asked Barua to reduce the import duties on power generation related equipment.

Representatives from the Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Foreign Investors Chamber of Commerce and Industry demanded continuation of the PSI (preshipment inspection) system for a few more years.

Barua said his ministry has left behind the traditional practices of dealing with state-owned factories.

"I am an ardent supporter of an industry-based economy, not tradebased economy."

The minister said he is working to increase contribution of the industries sector to 40 percent from 28 percent in a couple of years.

He assured industrialists that their recommendations would be passed on to the finance ministry and the national board of revenue soon.

Most sharecroppers unaware of banks' flexible lending programmes

Study reveals

Most sharecroppers are not aware of flexible lending programmes of the country's formal financial institutions, reveals a study.

"They have no idea about required documents, eligible loan amount, interest rate and repayment method", finds the study, conducted by Bangladesh Institute of Bank Management (BIBM).

In this regard authorities are required to go for massive promotional efforts, including roadshow, village-to-village campaign, and announce loan disbursement programme to create awareness, suggested the study formally presented at a roundtable in Dhaka yesterday.

Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr Atiur Rahman chaired the programme.

The study also pointed to the dearth of manpower banks now face and urged the government to appoint skilled officials to disseminate financial lending information properly.

Professor Abdul Jalil Chowdhury, director of BIBM, presented the study, Reaching out the Sharecroppers of Bangladesh with Financial Assistance-Means, Techniques and Methods.

During the survey it was found that in

most cases banks select borrowers haphazardly and do not form groups for disbursing loans among sharecroppers. 'Influence of local elite and touts' was also detected in lending.

The research also emphasised a complete farmer database and introduction of identity cards to reach the target group easily.

The BB governor said the government is now preparing a farmers' database, which will include their vital information. Pointing his finger at the absence of a

farm loan policy, Atiur Rahman laid bare the central bank's plan to formulate a first-ever such policy.

On farmers' being unaware of a loan scheme at 2 percent interest rate for import substitute crop cultivation, the central bank chief said such loan disbursement has increased in the last one year.

This year the government has provided Tk 11 lakh to the commercial banks as subsidy

against such loans, while it was Tk 40,000 last year, Rahman said, adding that 4 percent subsidy are being given to banks against disbursement of farm loans at 2 percent interest rates.

Khondkar Ibrahim Khaled, chairman of Bangladesh Krishi Bank, urged the government to conduct a census to categorise farmers and sharecroppers properly. Dr Uttam Kumar Deb, additional director

and head of research at the Centre for Policy Dialogue, hailed the government's move to give loans to import substitute crop cultivators at 2 percent interest. M Fazlul Hoque, managing director of

Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank, said sharecroppers are the majority of the farmers. These sharecroppers cultivate over 40 percent of the arable lands. Some officials from banking and non-

banking financial institutions also spoke.

MASSIVE SME PLAN UNDERWAY

UNB adds: During a meeting with a delegation from the Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industries at his office yesterday, the BB governor told them that suggestions on SME loan policy would be sought from the managing directors of different banks whom he meets today (Wednesday).

"We've already taken suggestions from all the banks regarding the plan on small and medium enterprises. We'll discuss this broadly with all bank MDs on Wednesday to take their opinions," Rahman said. The central bank has already fixed a target

for all banks and financial institutions for distribution of Tk 23,995 crore in loans to SMEs this year to boost the potent sector. He urged the business delegation to

install effluent treatment plants in their factories for efficient waste management, and to contribute to environment-friendly industrialisation in the country. He also suggested that the industrialists

could take loans from an ETP fund set up by the bank for this purpose, if necessary. Atiur Rahman expressed his concern

over the crops preservation system, saying the country's food security is threatened due to such preservation constraints, although the country is experiencing a bumper output of crops.
