Hasina's India visit a National Day special for Bangladesh

Says Mark Tully in his article

BSS, New Delhi

"Celebrations of Bangladesh National Day always take me back to the heady days of 1972 when Sheikh Mujib signed a treaty of friendship with India, and India drew up a plan to assist in reconstructing his country which had been ravaged by the IndependenceWar."

Former BBC correspondent and author Mark Tully said this in an article published in the Indian media on the occasion of the 40th Independence and National Day of Bangladesh.

"By a strange irony of history the present Indian Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh was the authorofthat plan," he said.

Tully in his article also recalled his meeting with Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman during his first visit to Dhaka after liberation when Sheikh Mujib expressed his deep gratitude to India and a personal affection for the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.

"Unfortunately Sheikh Mujib and Indira Gandhi's dreams of two countries living in harmony, respecting each other, and establishing economic and other ties which would benefit both were not fulfilled.

While mentioning the agreements signed between the two countries during Sheikh Hasina's Delhi visit, the celebrated author said, the most exciting are the plans to improve Bangladesh's transport infrastructure and increase cross-border and transit traffic.

Much more important than that however are the economic benefits to both countries which will arise if they integrate their rail and road systems.

"India must ensure that all the agreements with Bangladesh are implemented and implemented speedily. It is of the utmost importance that Sheikh Hasina can show to the people of Bangladesh that her courageous decision to open a new chapter in relations with India has produced tangible benefits," it said. Mark Tully, however, appre-

hended of a very real danger that bureaucratic obfuscation in Delhi will stall the benefits of the agreements.

He opined, Sheikh Hasina for her part will have to combat those who say she is surrendering Bangladesh's interests to India.

"That means she will have to go the people of Bangladesh and sell her new policy to them. It is profoundly important for both countries and the whole of South Asia that India delivers on its commitments and Sheikh Hasina persuades Bangladeshis that their interests and India's interests can coincide," Tully concluded.

SC stays bail to Pintu

River dredging a must to increase hilsa output Experts tell seminar

River dredging will contribute to the increase in hilsa production by protecting sanctuaries and breeding places. Rivers have silted up over the years reducing

navigability that forced hilsa fish to change its natural habitats, and eventually the hilsa production suffered, said experts yesterday at a seminar, Needs for Preservation of the Hilsa Sanctuaries and Reproduction Areas to Develop Hilsa Resources.

Hilsa constitutes around 12 percent of the country's total fish production.

Indiscriminate fishing for jatka and mother hilsa is another reason for decrease in hilsa production, they added.

As part of the programmes of Jatka Preservation Week from March 21 to 27, Bangladesh Fisheries Research Institute (BFRI) organised the seminar at Bangladesh Agricultural Research Council auditorium.

The speakers said, about 60 to 70 percent jatka are netted between March and April every year. To prevent fishermen from catching jatka, the government imposed a ban on fishing at

three sanctuaries-- downstream of the Meghna, the Shahbajpur channel and the river Tetulia-during the period. In the Andhar Manik river, fishing is banned

from November to January. Mohammad Anisur Rahman, senior scientist o BFRI, reading out a keynote paper said, the programme has succeeded to some extent, as hilsa

production increased by 35 percent over 2001-02. Agriculture Minister Begum Motia Chowdhury at the seminar talked about some understanding with businessmen, which, she believes, can dissuade fishermen from catching jatka.

She also said the government will take steps soon to dredge the rivers as it is necessary to protect the habitats of hilsa fish, and the dredging programme will begin with the river Jamuna.

Minister for fisheries and livestock Abdul Latif Biswas said, "The government is maintaining four sanctuaries covering 330 kilometres of the rivers and one more sanctuary will be declared soon. A total of 1,65,000 fishermen who cannot catch fish from February to May are provided with 20,000 metric tons of food grains. They also come under training programmes for alternative jobs," he added.
