DMCH to keep watch on staff, brokers

16 CCTV cameras to be installed for surveillance to stop malpractice

ALPHA ARZU

Dhaka Medical College and Hospital is going to install closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras at all of its important points to stop brokers' manipulation and institutional misconduct. "At least 16 CCTVs will be installed at

emergency and pathology departments, blood bank, operation theatre and some other places to watch doctors, nurses, employees, patients, medical representatives and brokers," DMCH Director Brig Gen Shahidul Hoque Mallik told The Daily Star.

The surveillance system will be introduced within a week, he said. The plan is to observe movement of brokers, check mismanagement and also to ensure that patients get proper treatment and quality

The director said every day on an average over 600 patients visit outdoor department of 1,700-bed DMCH and at least 400 patients get admitted. Many of them fall victim to brokers.

Brokers roam freely mainly at the emergency and pathology departments and blood bank. They persuade patients to go to private clinics or hospitals.

Whenever the relatives of a patient in critical condition fail to manage blood the brokers take the opportunity for making money by bringing blood from some unauthorised private centres. The blood is often found to be contaminated, sources at the hospital said.

37 killed in major Pak offensive

Troops intensify fight against Taliban

AFP, Peshawar

Pakistan said yesterday 32 militants and five soldiers were killed in the heaviest battle of a new assault against Arab, Afghan and Uzbek fighters after touting a US vote of confidence. The fight in Orakzai district, part of Pakistan's north-western

tribal belt shadowing the border with Afghanistan that Washington considers an al-Qaeda headquarters, was the deadliest such incident for Pakistani troops in months. Paramilitary and army troops on Wednesday expanded their

campaign against Taliban believed to have fled a major offensive in South Waziristan last year by launching an assault to eradicate them from neighbouring Orakzai. Dozens of Islamist fighters stormed a security check post at

Kalaya, on the outskirts of the district's main town, sparking a counter-attack that finally recaptured the post overnight, the military said.

"Thirty-two militants were killed in yesterday's clash in Kalaya. Those killed in the fighting were mostly Uzbek and Arabs. We have their bodies," Frontier Corps (FC) paramilitary Major General Tariq Khan told reporters.

The army also confirmed that five security personnel, including a lieutenant colonel, were killed in the fighting.

The military has so far announced a running death toll of 68 militants in the Orakzai operation, but none of the tolls can be verified independently because access by reporters to the remote areas involved is extremely limited.

Pakistan's mountainous and semi-autonomous tribal belt became a stronghold for hundreds of Taliban and al-Qaedalinked extremists who fled Afghanistan to regroup and launch cross-border attacks after the US-led invasion in late 2001.

Millions turn lights off today for 'Earth Hour' AFP, Sydney

World-famous landmarks including the Pyramids, the Eiffel Tower and Beijing's Forbidden City to go dark today as millions turn out the lights for "Earth Hour", a rolling grassroots movement aimed at tackling climate change.


Now in its fourth year, the campaign promises to be the biggest yet with thousands of cities and towns in 125 countries -- 37 more than last year -- pledging to take part in the aftermath of a failed climate summit last year.

December's fractious Copenhagen summit has done nothing to dampen public hopes for meaningful action to avert catastrophic global warming, according to Earth Hour founder Andy Ridley.

"There appears to be some fatigue to the politics around it... But people are far more motivated this year than they were last year," he told AFP.
