# Selectors on sticky wicket

The national cricket selectors have two days to name the final squad for next month's World Twenty20 Championship in the

West Indies, but the timing isn't ideal for them. The Tigers have just finished playing a

gruelling Test series against England at home and all of them have flown to Sharjah to play the Port City League but the delay of that tournament adds to the selectors' dilemma. If they want to pick any new player in the squad, they would have only a few matches to make a final decision. And with chief selector Rafiqul Alam saying yesterday that they have experimentation on their mind, this

could be a tight affair.

"We could experiment with one or two new faces as it is in different conditions and it's a different format. But the decision hasn't yet been taken since we have 2-3 days left," said Rafiqul.

"But we have to select the team and then see how they go about their job in the two T20 tournaments," he said.

The 30-man preliminary squad, announced on March 1, have the likes of Elias Sunny, Robiul Islam and Rony Talukder along with Jahirul Islam, who made his Test debut last week. Other domestic performers Aftab Ahmed, Alok Kapali, Nasir Hossain, Nazmul Hossain Milon, Faisal Hossain, Mohammad Mithun and Shamsur Rahman have also been included.

Among those, Aftab is at the forefront

for selection alongside Nazmul Hossain Milon. An all-rounder from Dhaka, Milon, has big-hitting abilities and always remains in the fringes whenever a Twenty20 team is being talked about.

A case for left-hander Faisal Hossain could be made since he has been a heavy scorer in the domestic scene, doing particularly well in the shorter versions.

While all these would make up the balance of the squad, a return for Mohammad Ashraful seems imminent. Even though the chief selector termed it 'still in the process', the right-handed batsman could not be far away from the selectors' mind.

Ashraful, playing for Chittagong Mohammedan in the PCL, must make the most of the tournament opener against

# PCL time in Sharjah

The second version of the Port City League (PCL), the Bashundhara Cup T20 will kick off today at the Sharjah Cricket Stadium.

The start of this year's Twenty20 tournament was deferred by two days due to visa complications. The organisers failed to launch the tournament on March 26 as a number of players as well as the broadcasters didn't receive the required travel documents visa in time.

It was learnt that still there were few players waiting to get visa and the broadcasters were expected to land in the United Arab Emirates last night. However there is very slim chance that satellite channel ATN Bangla will be able to telecast the first match live between Chittagong Mohammaden and Top Sports Noakhali at 5pm Bangladesh time, but the organisers hoped that the opening ceremony and the second match between Dhaka Sports and Biman would be aired. Chittagong Tigers, Pirates of Chittagong, Brothers and Bengal Tigers are the other teams in the competition.

The organisers took the help of local experts so that ATN Bangla can beam the live coverage of the opening ceremony.

Despite all the mismanagement, the organisers were optimistic about the success of the tournament as PCL chairman AZM Nasiruddin

said that the image of the local Bangladeshi community would be brightened if the tournament succeeded in Sharjah.

According to UNB, he said while addressing a press conference at the Ramada Hotel yesterday that they had to undergo some difficulties to obtain visas for the huge Bangladeshi contingent as the local authority was very cautious in issuing entry permits for their experience of some illegal immigrants among the Bangladeshi community here.

The organisers were also impressed by the huge interest of the local Bangladeshis about the tournament. Nasir indicated that the tournament fixtures might be rescheduled considering the players' national duty ahead of the T20 World Cup and the T20 National League.

The tournament is an opportunity for the national cricketers to prepare themselves for the upcomingWorldT20 to be held in the West Indies and former Bangladesh skipper Mohammad Ashraful, who is captaining the Chittagong Mohammedan side, hoped that everybody would try their best in the tournament.

"It's a brilliant opportunity for the players ahead of the World T20. I hope it would be a very good tournament. I am looking forward to performing well in the tournament," said Ashraful while addressing at a pre-match press conference at Ramada Hotel yesterday.

"We don't have much experience in T20 game, so this kind of tournament is always helpful for us," he added.

New Zealand dismissed their highly-fancied opponents for 231 and then finished at 19 for 1 as they dream of levelling the two-game series.

Tim Southee accepted extra responsibility to back up his captain after the hosts picked two spinners and he provided a clever performance with 4 for 61. But the star was Vettori, who earned more worthy plaudits in a praise-heavy week, with 4 for 36 off 19.3 overs.


