# N-plant stays in deal still

PM's forthcoming visit to Russia may get the power project back on track

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's upcoming visit to Russia in a couple of months might see a breakthrough in the sluggish progress of installing nuclear power plants in Bangladesh, foreign ministry officials have said.

A contract on cooperation for using atomic energy is likely to be signed between Dhaka and Moscow for installing two 1,000megawatt power plants in Bangladesh, they said.

An inter-ministerial meeting at the

foreign ministry yesterday discussed the progress made so far to that end.

"Foreign Minister Dipu Moni wanted to know the present status of talks with Russia," an official of Bangladesh Atomic Energy Commission told The Daily Star after the meeting with the foreign minister in chair.

The foreign minister enquired about the things that need to be completed before signing the contract, he said.

Dipu Moni is likely to visit Russia next month ahead of the premier's Russia visit, said foreign ministry officials.

The foreign minister asked the officials concerned to work sincerely and expedite the process of signing the contract with Russia on installation of nuclear power plants in Bangladesh, sources said.

Bangladesh failed to make any visible progress in this regard since signing of a protocol deal with Russia on October 21, 2009 on cooperation for peaceful usage of nuclear energy.

The deal was inked in Moscow during the visit of a nine-member Bangladesh delegation headed by State Minister for

#### Strike stops goods handling for 8hrs

The cargo handling at Chittagong port remained suspended for eight hours yesterday as the dockworkers abstained from work demanding reinstatement of their terminated colleagues.

The Chittagong Dock Bandar Sramik Karmachari Federation enforced the programme from 8:00am pressing for the rein-

statement of workers fired during the last interim government. The workers and employees also staged a sit-in in front of Bandar Bhaban, the office of Chittagong Port Authority (CPA).

The dockworkers got back to work in the afternoon.

The strike was called after a meeting between the shipping minister and a six-member team from the federation ended inconclusively.

#### Tk 3,000 fee fixed for MRP

The fee for emergency machine-readable passport (MRP) has been fixed at Tk 6,000 while Tk 3,000 will be charged for a normal MRP, according to a home ministry notification.

The fees for the MRP to be issued in foreign missions of the country will be different. Fee for an emergency MRP is \$200 while \$100 for normal ones

in abroad, says the notification. The 84-page new passport will be valid for five years.
