## Law to ensure fair wage on the cards

Says JS body chief

The government is working for bringing all the workers of agriculture sector under a specific law to ensure just wage and other facilities, Israfil Alam, chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on labour and employment ministry, said yesterday.

"A specific law is essential for the workers in agriculture sector because they are the base of our rural economy," he said.

The lawmaker was speaking at a consultation on formulating labour law for agriculture sector and designing advocacy strategies organised by Karmojibi Nari at the National Press Club yesterday.

Stressing the need for a labour court in every district, he said labour courts will help workers reap benefits of existing laws, he added.

He also said the government is working on amending the Labour Law-2006 to make it time befitting and more democratic.

He urged the leaders of the Karmojibi Nari and other organisations working for agriculture workers to place their proposals before the ministry and thus help the government draft the law.

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD) President Hasanul Haq Inu urged the government to recognise farmers as 'workers' in the amended labour law and ensure right to trade union.

The farmers are deprived of just wage, medical allowance, professional security and other facilities for lack of law, he added.

Communist Party of Bangladesh General Secretary Mujahidul Islam Selim demanded keeping a provision in the amended labour law for formulating a separate law for the workers of agriculture sector.

Ziaul Haque Mukta, acting country director of Oxfam, emphasised the need for unity among social and political forces and NGO workers to strengthen the movement to end all kinds of discriminations against the workers in agriculture sector and ensure their just wage.

Karmojibi Nari President Shirin Akhter moderated the meeting while Khetmojur Samity President Shamsuzzaman Selim, Jatiya Krishak Samity General Secretary Aminul Islam Golam, among others, also spoke at the meeting.

N'ganj people cry for gas


The protesters at a meeting threatened to block two roads between Narayanganj and the capital if the gas crisis is not
