The majority of patients requiring treatment at the ICDDR,B are from the capital's Mirpur, Khilkhet, Demra, Badda, Wirelessgate, Rampura areas, as well as Pagla in Narayanganj.

Shahjahan Siraj, a resident of Mirpur, Sheorapara, said, "Our water has been

smelly and dirty for the last month. "Even boiling it fails to remove the odour. "This is not only my complaint -- my neighbours are also suffering."

Babul from Khilkhet also complained of foul smelling water in his locality for the last two months.

Doctors have said that water and sanitation systems in the capital must be improved.

Scientist and Head of Longer Stay Unit of ICDDR,B Dr Shahadat Hossain said, "Around this time of year it is common for a significant number of people to suffer from diarrhoeal diseases.

"However the situation this year goes beyond the usual phenomenon. "If the government doesn't take the

issue seriously, the situation will continue to worsen," he warned.

Dr Hossain said that patient records at ICDDR,B indicate that the number of people suffering from diarreach has increased year on year.

On average, around 8,877 patients visited the ICDDR,B every month in 2006, SEE PAGE 7 COL 6

## Murdered for chiding pupil

Arrestees tell of plot behind killing Sylhet college teacher

The fiancé of a female student plotted the murder of associate professor Harun Ur Rashid as the teacher rebuked the pupil for her affair with the youth, revealed Rab's interrogation yesterday.

Rapid Action Battalion arrested the female student, Sujina Akhtar Munni, her classmate Safia Khatun Lipi, Russell Ahmed and Alimul Islam, friends of Munni's boyfriend Kawsar, and manager of a local hotel Lokman Bhuiyan, who sheltered Kawsar, from different places of the town in last two days.

Kawsar, son of a former Union Parishad chairman in Sunamganj, was hiding in the hotel, but managed to escape the battalion's dragnet.

## Dakat Shahid behind 2 old Dhaka murders

The Detective Branch of police has arrested accomplices of Dakat Shahid, who from India had instructed them to kill Dhaka City Corporation ward councillor Ahmed Hossain and goldsmith Prem Krishno Roy in old Dhaka recently.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police Commissioner AKM Shahidul Hoque made the disclosure yesterday at a press briefing held at DB office in the capital.

Though Shahid fled to India in 2005 in fear of encounter from law enforcers, his accomplices are still active in realising extortion especially from traders in old Dhaka. His gang also kills victims if they refuse to pay extortion money.

DB police said Shahid, who is now absconding in Nepal, is accused in dozens of cases including murder in the capital.

The gang killed Ahmed after Md Nazim Uddin, chairman of Shubhadda union parishad of Keraniganj, hired Shahid following a dispute with him [Ahmed].

Prem also became Shahid's target due to his refusal to pay Tk 10 lakh as extortion, Shahid's accomplice Shahidul Islam Biddyut disclosed this yesterday after his arrest from Sayadabad in the capital on March 28.

DB police also arrested Shahid's another accomplice shooter Kazi Kawsar from Dhulaipar and UP chairman Nazim from Bijoynagar in the capital on the same day.

**Assistant Returning Officer** Md Hasanuzzaman received their nomination papers at Lalmohan of Bhola yesterday morning.


