


## Tevez thrashes Wigan

## Dog bites Maradona

Argentina coach Diego Maradona has been hospitalized after one of his dogs bit him while he was playing with the animal at home, TV reports said Tuesday.

One report said that the 49year-old former footballing great had been bitten on his upper lip and would need a minor operation to repair the wound.

Sources at the Los Arcos private clinic, where Maradona spent several weeks in 2007 for treatment after developing serious health problems, confirmed that he had been admitted, but would not say what the problem was.

#### 2-match ban on Drogba

Ever since the reigning European champions were paired with Henry's former club, fans of the beautiful game have been licking their lips in anticipation of a rare meeting between two sides whose commitment to the sport's purist principles is unmatched across the world.

Henry, who joined Barca in 2007, will be one of the most recognisable faces amongst a galaxy of stars in north London and he is guaranteed a rapturous reception from the Arsenal faithful.

But the France star, who won two Premier League titles, three FA Cups and scored a club-record 226 goals in 369 games for Arsenal, is far from certain to start after spending much of his time on the bench recently. It is a prospect that doesn't unduly concern him.

"I'm not saying I won't try to fight or whatever because that's the way the game is. But I don't want to play against Arsenal," Henry said.

"Before the draw I said that I did not want to face Arsenal. To return home is strange and even more so in the quarterfinals of the Champions League.

## Inter battling fatigue

Inter Milan's defeat to AS Roma at the weekend has sparked worries that the Serie A leaders are suffering from fatigue ahead of Wednesday's

Champions League quarterfinal, first leg at home to CSKA Moscow. While the rest of Italy's teams crashed

out of Europe one after another, Inter remain their country's only flag bearers on the continent and they are also still in the Italian Cup, facing a semifinal, second leg next month. But while they are still on course for a

remarkable treble, their league form has disintegrated over the last month and a half. Although they beat English Premier

League heavyweights Chelsea twice in the last round of the Champions League, at home they have been in crisis. Two wins in nine matches has seen their once 14-point lead over second-

placed AS Roma reduced to a single point. But top scorer Diego Milito, who netted on Saturday but was denied an injury time equaliser by the post, claims tired-

gone from strength to strength.

try to do our best," he said.

"All these commitments are in themselves a motivation, not a problem. Our desire to win is stronger than our fatigue."

And that desire to win might just be stronger in Europe than at home as Inter bid to end a dire recent record on the continent and reach their first Champions League semi-final since 2003, when they lost to neighbours AC Milan, who went on to beat another Italian side Juventus in the final.

Coach Jose Mourinho was brought to the club as a replacement for Roberto Mancini, despite the Italian leading the team to three straight Serie A titles, in order to bring European success to the

Pakistani cricket star Shoaib Malik and India's top female tennis player Sania Mirza plan to wed in a unique union bridging the two nations' bitter sporting and political divide. "My wedding is going to be

the biggest day of my life," Mirza said in a statement late Monday from her home town of Hyderabad, where she is recovering from a wrist injury that has seen her ranking slip from 27 in 2007 to 92.

The sporting marriage, seemingly unprecedented in the perennial rivalry between the nuclear-armed South Asian rivals, comes two months after Mirza broke off her engagement to a childhood friend. "I have been in the con-

stant glare for too long and would appreciate the privacy at this very personal moment in my life," said the 23-yearold starlet, whose short skirts have drawn the ire of Islamist

groups in India. Mirza and Malik, 28, who are both Muslim, will marry in April and live in Dubai, members of the two families told local media.

Malik, a former national captain who is currently serving a year-long ban by the Pakistan Cricket Board due to indiscipline, confirmed the imminent nuptials.
