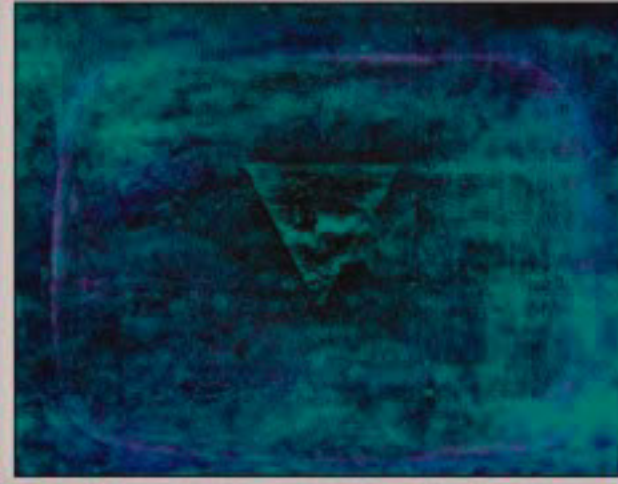

Forever ablaze in memory

Book fair and film festival on Liberation War

 To generate interest in the history of the Liberation War among the post-war generations and to reiterate the call for trial of war criminals, Bangladesh Enterprise for Development and Security Studies have arranged a three-day-long book fair along with a film festival on Liberation War. Starting from March 31, the events are on at the premises of Central Public Library, Shahabagh.

Jote. One of the trustees of Liberation War Museum, Mofidul Haque, also spoke on the occasion.
 "We are collectively liable to the nation as we are yet to try the war criminals," Mofidul Haque said.
 ABM Tajul Islam said, "The government is determined to try war criminals in a way that it will carry a positive message for people around the globe."
 Nasiruddin Yousuff elaborately discussed the ground of conscience of Liberation War. He mentioned with dates the roles of the cronies of the Pakistani army -- *Razakar, Al Badr* and *Al Shams*. "The war is still on. We must defeat these anti-Liberation War forces through united efforts," he said.

Two films "Ekatturer Jishu" and "Shey Kotha Boley Jai" directed by Nasiruddin Yousuff and Fauzia Khan respectively were screened at the festival.
 "Ekatturer Jishu" is based on a story by Shahriar Kabir. Liberation War Museum, Laser Vision, Mawla Brothers, Shahitya Prokash, Ityadi Grontho Prokash, Banolata Prokashoni and others are participating in the fair with their publications (books and CDs).

This movie stands out for its unusual story and high calibre performance by versatile actor Humayun Faridee. The story follows a Christian priest and his experiences during the Liberation War.
 "Shilalipi," "Agami," "Rabeya" and "Aguner Paroshmini" directed by Shamim Akhtar, Morshedul Islam, Tanvir Mokammel and Humayun Ahmed respectively were also screened yesterday on the occasion.
 Today the festival will end through screening three films -- "Muktri Kotha," "Kaan Petey Roi" and "Joyjatra" directed by Tareque Masud, Mofidul Haque and Tauquir Ahmed respectively.

Chapainawabganj abuzz with activity

A two-day anti-corruption fair, youth assemblage and cultural festival were held amidst festivity in Chapainawabganj on Monday and Tuesday. Sachetan Nagorik Committee (SNC), a unit of Transparency International (TIB), organised the programme at Horimohon Government High School premises in Chapainawabganj district headquarters. The objective of the programme was to motivate youth to say no to corruption.
 Deputy Commissioner, Chapainawabganj K.M. Ali Azam was chief guest at the inaugural ceremony, while convener of SNC, Chapainawabganj advocate Saiful Islam Reza chaired the event. Dr. Muktara Begum, civil surgeon Professor Sirazuddin were present as special guests. Among others Shumona Sultan, programme officer of TIB, Abdul Latif, Head Master of Horimohon Government High School, N.S.M. Mahbubur Rahman, member of Sachetan Nagorik Committee, Golam

 Earlier, a colourful anti-corruption rally was taken out from Horimohon Government High School premises. Government officials, including the Deputy Commissioner, teachers, students of different schools and colleges and NGO activists attended the rally.
 A discussion was held on the second day of the

programme. Sadeka Halim, member of the Information Commission was chief guest.
 Speakers urged all sections of society, especially youth and students, to come forward to root out corruption, which acts as barrier to the economic development of the country.
 Weeding out corruption, they added, is a must for the development of Bangladesh as an emerging nation.
 After the discussion, a

cultural programme was held in the fair premises. Local artistes and eminent singer Rathindra Nath Roy gave music renditions.
 The festival attracted thousands of people from different parts of the district. Many of them expressed the hope that such fairs would be a regular fixture.
 A total of 41 stalls were set up at the fair premises. Different government offices and non government organisations took part in the fair.

Five-day International children film festival begins

A five-day children's film festival began in Tangail on Thursday.
 The Tangail district unit of Children's Film Society (CFS) organised the festival at Bhasani Hall in the town for the second time in the district. Shaheen Shikha Paribar in Tangail sponsored the festival.
 Additional Deputy Commissioner (Revenue) in Tangail, Abdus Sattar Sheikh, inaugurated the festival in the morning and addressed a discussion.

and The Panlid" (Brazil), "Duratta" (Bangladesh), "Tokai" (Bangladesh) and "Taare Zameen Par" (India).
 A large number of enthusiastic viewers, including school children and their guardians, attended the inaugural day's films.
 The films to be screened on the other days of the festival include "Diary" (Italy), "The Crocodiles" (Germany), "The Blue Umbrella" (India), "Mozart in China" (Austria), "Ruddi" (Estonia), "Dipu Number-2" and "Chhuti Ghanta" (Bangladesh), "Homeland" (China), "The Kid" (United States) and "Series of Harry Potter" (UK).
