Aila woes worsen

Water board started embankment-repairing 6 months after receiving fund; govt disappointed with poor donor response

As the plight of villagers intensifies on a vast swath of coastal land hit by cyclonic storm Aila ten months ago, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will meet disaster and water officials tomorrow to find a solution to perennial water logging in the region.

Meantime, the government's climate fund is yet to be channelled to the Aila victims despite repeated calls from different corners because of sloth decision-making.

Worst still, although the Water Development Board (WDB) received Tk 40 crore in cash, and Tk 75 crore in wheat in July last year from the food ministry to repair breached embankments,

The Aila victims are now on a desperate edge as new breaches developed in the embank-

it took them six months even to start the work.

ment three days ago, inundating fresh areas with brackish water. For the last ten months, nothing grows on the inundated land, and cry for drinking water is peaking.

Quoting Aila victims, Food and Disaster Management Minister Md Abdur Razzaque told a group of reporters in his office yesterday that water level at the affected area has risen to a new height this year. "People of the region have not seen such a rise in the past," the minister said.

A visibly unhappy Razzaque said over the last couple of months they made desperate attempts to repair the breaches in the embankments.

"We even engaged the army to repair and protect the embankments in a bid to save people from being marooned, but water is gushing through newer breaches, flooding more villages," the minister said.

To free five rivers in and around Dhaka of pollution and illegal occupation, the government is going to take up a Tk 944 crore project.

The Project for Reclamation of the Buriganga River is going to be placed before the Executive Committee on National Economic Council (Ecnec) today for approval.

The New Dhaleshwari, Pungli, Bangshai, Turag and Buriganga rivers would be under this project. Its aim is to improve the quality of water by increasing water flow in the Buriganga and the Turag during the dry season and navigability by dredging.

The project also aims to develop irrigation and fisheries. The project work will start on July, 2010 and will be completed by June 2014.

The project documents say in the last several decades the flow of the Buriganga, Turag, Shitalakkhya and Balu dropped significantly.



ACC starts to list graft cases

The Anti-Corruption Commission has instructed its investigation officers to identify the cases remained stayed on the same ground as that against Awami League lawmaker Habibur Rahman Mollah.

ACC lawyers said over 500 more petitions against corruption cases filed by the anti-graft body are now pending with the High Court and they believe the same fate as Mollah's awaits the cases.

Though not sure about the exact number of corruption cases stayed upon the petitions, the ACC asked its IOs to consult the ACC lawyers for having the stays on their cases vacated soon.

"As soon as we get a copy of the Supreme Court verdict, we will go to the High Court for having the stays vacated," said Ghulam Rahman, chairman of the commission.

"Now the trial of corruption suspects would be held on substantive allegations doing away with mistake in formalities or

procedure in filing the case," Ghulam Rahman added. ACC sources said officials concerned already held meeting with IOs yesterday and gave necessary instructions in this regard.

ACC Chief Counsellor Anisul Haque said it would take a couple of days to determine whether they would move with the cases individually or all together. The ACC sees a ray of hope for the anti-graft drive as the SC on


