Govt seeks 600MW from rental by Aug

PM to review power project progress today

SHARIER KHAN

Irked by the power ministry's failure to make much headway in new power project implementation, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina sits today at the power and energy ministry to review progress of existing schemes, sources say.

The power ministry would make a presentation on the progress and how it could quickly minimise the ongoing load-shedding scenario, partially worsened due to rental power projects

To minimise the load-shedding, the prime minister has already directed the ministry to take up any measure to quickly implement some power projects for short-terms.

The ministry has accordingly decided to invite unsolicited offers from international rental power companies instead of novice local companies, which had failed to deliver in due time.

But to get benefits from such unsolicited deals, the government would have to make exclusive decisions.

This is being considered as the only practical solution to the existing power crisis.

International professional rental power companies can install 500-600 megawatt power generation system within four months.

"If the prime minister and the purchase committee approve of such deals, we can conclude some deals within this month so that we can reduce the level of load-shedding by July-August," comments a top Power Development Board (PDB) source.

However, these deals will have duration of six to nine months, the source adds.

Sources say the Power Division will seek the premier's approval for modification of the existing procurement policy to accommodate the unsolicited deals.

PAC hopes to clear backlog by this year

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of the Jatiya Sangsad has stepped up efforts to clear a huge backlog of unresolved audit reports piled up since fiscal year 1972-73 by disposing of the objections to those within this year, committee members said.

Four sub-committees formed by the PAC in May last year has started submitting their recommendations for disposal of the audit objections made from FY 1972-73 to 2005-06.

On scrutiny of the objections at a series of meetings, the sub-committees are recommending realising the money from people after FY-2005-06. responsible for the financial damage caused, or settling the objections, committee officials said.

"It is possible to get rid of the backlog of audit reports this year if we can work properly," Ali Ashraf, who heads a sub-committee, told this correspondent yesterday.

Since 1972-73, around 1,000 audit reports involving thousands of crore taka were placed before parliament. But only 206 reports were discussed till expiry of tenure of the last eighth parliament.

In another development, the PAC yesterday decided to meet almost every working day to expedite disposal of the unresolved objections till FY 2005-2006 so that it can scrutinise audit on recent expenditures.

"We asked the office of comptroller and auditor general (CAG) to update audit reports as far as possible. We want to examine recent expenditures of public money," PAC Chairman Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir said, when contacted after its meeting yesterday.

The office of CAG is yet to furnish reports

"We observed that the reports are mostly superficial lacking substantial information. So, we asked the CAG to compile reports primarily based on performance of various ministries and government departments," the committee chief said.

The PAC yesterday asked the office of CAG to inform it in 15 days about compliance of






