Eight people were killed in separate road accidents in Bogra, Rajshahi and Brahmanbaria

yesterday. Staff correspondent from Bogra reports: Five persons, including an army man, were killed and another seriously injured in two separate road

accidents in Bogra yesterday. The dead were identified as army man Lance Corporal Nazrul Islam, 32, Sherpur Dairy Firm Veterinary Assistant Asaduzzaman Jewel, 34, an unidentified man aged about 40, rickshaw driver Sadek Ali Harun, 52 and padestrian Bulu Miah, 52.

Police said three people, including the army man, died on the spot when a Rangpur-bound coach hit a CNG-run autorickshaw at Hajipara under Sherpur upazila around 12:00
