PM talks option for open pit

But says rehabilitation to be done first

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has said Barapukuria coal mine might be converted into the country's first open pit mine after completely rehabilitating the local people affected by the on-going underground mining activi-

The PM said this while discussing with officials at the power ministry how to address the perennial power and energy crises. She mainly focused on the progress of power projects during the nearly four-hour meeting on Wednesday.

Meeting sources said the premier ruled out mining at Phulbari now or in the near future on political considerations.

"At one stage of the discussion, the prime minister mentioned that the land in Barapukuria mining area is already damaged

and has subsided. After paying compensation to people for the loss of land and rehabilitating them, the mine could be converted into an open pit mine," one source said.

She noted that while many countries could easily implement open pit mining to extract up to 90 percent of their coal deposits, a densely populated agriculture-based country like Bangladesh could not go for such mining method so easily.

Officials say underground mining allows extraction of up to 20 percent of the deposits.

Barapukuria mine has a deposit of 389 million tonnes of coal. But the present underground mining design would allow extraction of only 30 million tonnes over a period of 30 years, and leave a 4.5-square kilometre area at least one to two metres subsided and of no use, they say.



RU provosts protest BCL attack

Demand punishment to culprits

Provost Council, an association of provosts of 16 Rajshahi University halls, observed work abstention yesterday demanding punishment of the BCL cadres who had attacked university proctor, Shaheed Samsuzzoha hall provost and othersWednesday night.

Prof Belayet Hossain, convener of the council, said they observed the programme protesting at the attack by BCI activists at Shaheed Samsuzzoha Hall, and demand immediate steps to punish

He called upon the government and the university authorities to take legal action against the BCL men.

He also threatened tougher movements if the cadres are not punished within seven days.

Earlier on Thursday night in an emergency meeting, the provosts of 16 residential halls took the decision of observing one-day work abstention protesting the incident.

Plane crash kills Polish president

Army chief, central bank gov among 96 dead

A plane carrying Polish president Lech Kaczynski and much of the country's military and state elite crashed in thick fog in Russia yesterday killing all 96 people on board in a blazing inferno.

The ageing Russian jet was taking Kaczynski and his wife, the military chief of staff and other top officers, central bank governor, deputy foreign minister, members of parliament and other senior officials to a ceremony for thousands of Polish troops

massacred by Russian forces in World War II. The Tupolev Tu-154 plane hit treetops in fog as it approached

Smolensk airport in western Russia and broke up in flames, regional governor Sergei Antufiev said. The jet came down a few hundred metres (yards) short of the

runway at Smolenk's Severny airport. "It clipped the tops of the trees, crashed down and broke into pieces," Antufiev told Russia-24 television news network.

"There were no survivors." Russian news agencies said pilot error was suspected. The wreckage was scattered across a forest with parts of it still

on fire, Russian television images showed. One of the black box flight recorders was quickly found, news agencies reported. As well as killing the 60-year-old head of state, the crash

EC's poll plan at stake

It counts on govt intention to hold elections to local bodies in time

The government's foot dragging to amend laws for polls to union parishads and municipalities and reluctance to hold the DCC elections in May is likely to upset the Election Commission's plans for this year's series of elections.

The EC last February asked the LGRD ministry to amend the laws so that it could hold polls, between May and July, without re-demarcation of the boundaries of wards under union

parishads and municipalities, EC officials said. Local Government (union parishad) Act and Local Government (municipality) Act say that

every ward should be demarcated maintaining no more than 10 percent population disparity among them. To avert possible "social disorder" due to the

re-demarcation of wards before the upcoming elections, EC wanted the government to amend the acts so that the EC could hold the polls without re-demarcating the boundaries and SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

2 killed in 'crossfire'

1 killed in clash over pay hike

A clash between agitating garment factory workers and criminals left one dead and at least 10 injured in Kanchpur of Narayanganj early vesterday.

The deceased was identified as Zia, 25, a resident of

Kanchpur. Sources said around 2,000 disgruntled workers of Opex and Sinha Group started demonstrations inside the factory around 7:30am demanding increased pay, attendance allowance, overtime allowance, leave allowance and wage increments.

They said scrap-garment trader Shamsul Haq and his son Zia, along with a gang of criminals attacked the workers around 8:30am that led to the clash.

Zia, who was critically injured during the clash, was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where he died at 12:30pm.

The workers also beat up Shamsul, alleged thug of the factory owner, and threw him into a pond. The police later rescued him.
