MURDERS OF TWO CU STUDENTS Punish real culprits, drop false charges against Prof Munir Cuta tells journalists

Chittagong University Teachers Association (Cuta) leaders yesterday demanded withdrawal of 'false' charges against the former association president and punishment to those involved in murders of CU students Mohiuddin and Harun-or-Rashid. They also threatened to go for tougher agitation programme if their demands not met immediately. At a press conference held at Chittagong Press Club in the afternoon, the leader said former Cuta president Professor Dr ANM Munir Ahmad was implicated in Mohiuddin Masum murder case. Mohiuddin was killed near Sholoshahar Gate No. 2 on February 11 night. Prof Munir, also senior teacher of CU political science department, along with Prof Rashida Khanom went to attend the namaj-e-janaza of Mohiuddin, a masters final year student of their department, at Chittagong Medical

College Hospital (CMCH) on February 12 morning. Since the janaja could not be held at CMCH due to a tense situation there because of the presence of leaders and activists of Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Chhtra Shibir, Prof Munir left CMCH premise to offer Juma prayers at neighbouring Nasirabad Housing Society Mosque, said the Cuta leaders. But, he was unfortunately made an accused in the case filed in connection with Jamaat-Shibir clash with police. Later, CU VC Prof Dr Abu Yusuf certified that Prof Munir had no link with the Jamaat-Shibir men and requested Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) Commissioner for dropping his name from the case, said the Cuta leaders. Although police agreed to do that but his name still remains on the list of accused even after two months, they resented. The Cuta leaders also demanded proper investigation into the murders of Mohiuddin Masum and Harun-or-Rashid.

Army chief in Aila-hit areas, sees repair of embankments

Army chief General Abdul Mobin Chowdhury yesterday visited the worst Aila-hit areas in Shyamnagar and Assassuni upazilas to see the reconstruction work of the breached embankments. The reconstruction work is now in progress at Jhhapa closure point in Padmapukur union in Shyamnagar upazila and Chakla closure point in Pratapnagar union in Assassuni upazila. During the visit General Mobin told the Aila victims that the reconstruction work will be completed before the monsoon and the affected people will be able to return to their villages. Stressing the need for maintaining standard of the construction, he urged the authorities to complete the deed of contract with the contractors concerned without delay. The army chief came to Satkhira by helicopter that landed at Nokipur High School ground yesterday morning. He was taken to Atulia Union Parishad office where the commanding officer of 55 Infantry Division showed him the progress of the work.

SATURDAY'S CLASH IN MAGURA

23 leaders of rival BNP factions held

Twenty-three leaders of two rival factions of BNP arrested on charge of their involvement in Saturday's clash were sent to jail hajat yesterday after being produced before the Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court. The arrestees include former upazila chairman Sayed Ali Karim and Mohammadpur Sadar UP chairman Akhteruzzaman, president and general secretary of Mohammadpur upazila BNP's rebel group and principal of Mohammadpur Aminur Rahman Degree College BNP leader Matiuir Rahman, another BNP leader Prof Yunus Ali Sardar, president of Shalikka upazila unit Jatiyotabadi Jubo Dal (JJD) Toilet Munshi and JJD cadre Mushtak Ahmed. Police on Saturday night arrested the leaders for their alleged involvement in Saturday's clash between two rival factions of Magura district unit BNP after sub-inspector of Magura Sadar police Subhas Chandra Biswas filed two separate cases under Explosives Substances Act. Eighty-six leaders and activists of BNP's two

factions were accused in the cases. The accused include president and secretary of Magura district unit BNP Kabir Murad and Ali Ahmed Biswas and secretary of the rebel group Iqbal Akhter Khan Kafur. At least 16 peoplemagistrate Uttam Kumar Roy, four police constables and 11 BNP activists were injured during a factional clash over holding party meetings separately on Saturday afternoon. Cadres of the rival groups exploded at least 30 bombs and fired gunshots during the clash. Party insiders said a faction led by BNP district unit president Kabir Murad had organised a meeting at Asaduzzaman auditorium in the town while general secretary of the same unit's rebel group Iqbal Akhter Khan Kafur called a separate meeting on the premises of his residence on Saturday afternoon triggering a conflict between two rival factions. The two factions locked in a clash when supporters of Kafur with bombs, firearms and lethal weapons attacked a procession led by vice-president of the district unit Monowar Hossain Khan on way to the meeting venue at Asaduzzaman auditorium.

Locals protest 'misdeeds' of a constable in Rajshahi

Locals of Motihar area in Rajshahi city on Saturday formed a human chain demanding action against a constable of Motihar police station for his alleged criminal acts and harassment to the people. Around 200 people formed the human chain at Talaimari crossing at around 11:00 am. Later at rally, the speakers alleged that Motihar police station constable Anwar Hossain often harassed locals and threatened them to file false cases if they (locals) refused to meet his illegal demands. They also alleged that Anwar is involved with different crimes like drug peddling

and mugging. Speakers called upon the police administration to take immediate steps to suspend Anwar. They also threatened to go for tougher agitation programme if no action is taken against the constable immediately. Ward councillor Ansar Ali and woman councillor Nurunnahar and several victims of the area spoke at the rally. Police constable Anwar was not available for his comment. Tofazzel Hossain, officer-in-charge of Motihar police station told this correspondent that he will take necessary steps after investigating the matter.

Opposition chief whip gets bail

LAND DISPUTE Old man beaten to death, ten injured in Savar clash

An elderly man was beaten to death and 10 others were injured in an attack by a rival group over land dispute at Sardaganj in Sadar upazila yesterday morning. The deceased was identified as Abdul Karim, 70. Police said there was enmity between Malek Kazi and Abdul Karim over a piece of land. Malek along with his supporters, equipped with lethal weapons, attacked Abdul Karim in his house at 10:30 am and beat him up mercilessly, leaving him dead on the spot and injuring his sons and neighbours. Later the assailants set ablaze his house and fled away. Being enraged by the incident, locals brought out a protest procession and blocked Kashimpur-Sreepur road for two hours demanding arrest of the criminals. On information, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. Police also arrested Kashem Ali, 30, and Ruhul Amin, 32, in this connection. Additional police have been deployed in the area to maintain law and order.

Touchstone statue recovered

A touchstone statue worth Tk 1.50 crore was recovered from a pond at Kaligram village in Manda upazila on Saturday noon. Locals said, while re-excavating the pond in Nalpuria area of the village two labourers found the statue of Lord Vishnu and tried to keep it secret. But locals took away the statue from them and handed it over to the members of local Jagarani Jubo Unnayan Samabaya Samity. Later, on information, police seized the statue weighing 135 kg.

Robbery in Satkhira

Robbers looted valuables worth Tk 15 lakh from a house in Sultanpur area of the district town early Saturday. Locals said a gang numbering 6/7 stormed into the house of Kazi Shahidul Islam at about 2:00am and took the house members hostage at gunpoint. They later looted Tk 2.5 lak in cash, 25 tolas of gold ornaments, Mobile phone sets and other valuables worth Tk 15 lakh. Police later held Sheikh Mamun and Billal Hossain following a case filed by Shahidul.

Youth stabbed to death

A young man was stabbed to death allegedly by his rival at Purbo Somalia village in Chatkhil upazila on Saturday evening. The deceased was identified as Zahir, 35, son of Shamsuddin of the village. Police quoting locals said there was a conflict between the families of Shamsuddin and Kalu Mia over digging of a disputed pond. The two families in the dispute agreed to go for arbitration in the evening. But Kalu Mia's son Suman refused to accept the decision of the arbitration. Coming out from the arbitration angry Suman attacked and stabbed Zahir indiscriminately leaving him critically injured. Zahir died at the local health complex.

Housewife murdered

A housewife was beaten to death allegedly for dowry at Fathehpur village under Nabinagar upazila of the district yesterday. Victim Rina Begum, 22, was wife of Kamal Mia of the village. According to locals and police, in-laws of Rina were demanding one and a half tola of gold as dowry from her father. As her father refused to give it, she was often tortured by in-laws and husband. On the fateful day yesterday she was beaten by the in-laws mercilessly causing her instant death. Police went to the spot and recovered the body. A case was filed with Nabinagar police in this connection.
