HC Verdict on TAC yet to be Released

ACC waits for legal advice on corrupt suspects

The attorney general's office could not decide whether legal action can be taken against 452 self-declared corrupt people, as the copy of the High Court (HC) verdict on the Truth and Accountability Commission (TAC) has not yet been released.

In a letter on February 4, the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) requested the attorney general to give legal advice on whether it can start legal proceedings against the 452 people who had disclosed their illegal assets to TAC and sought clemency during the military-backed caretaker government, sources said.

Asked about the ACC's request, Attorney General Mahbubey Alam told The Daily Star recently that his office cannot give any legal opinion without going through the full text of the HC

verdict on TAC.

In November 2008, the HC upon a writ petition declared illegal and unconstitutional the Voluntary Disclosure of Information Ordinance-2008 through which the caretaker government had formed the TAC.

Under the ordinance, 452 people had sought clemency and pledged to pay Tk 36 crore they earned through illegal means. Of the amount, Tk 34 crore has been realised by TAC, sources said.

However, ACC counsel Khurshid Alam Khan said there is no bar on ACC taking legal action against these corrupt people, as they were not tried for their individual offences.

Advocate Asaduzzaman, a lawyer for the petitioners who filed the writ challenging the TAC ordinance, said the corruption suspects, who returned their illgotten money to the TAC, should be subjected to prosecution under the laws and rules of the ACC.

On August 25 in 2008, Awami League leader Dipu Moni, now foreign minister, SC lawyer Adilur Rahman Khan, Ubinig Executive Director Farida Akhter and Odhikar's acting director Nasiruddin Elan filed the writ petition as public interest litigation (PIL).

On November 13, 2008, an HC bench of Justice Mir Hasmat Ali and Justice Shamim Hasnain declared illegal and unconstitutional the Voluntary Disclosure of Information Ordinance-2008.

But the copy of the judgement has not been released yet, Advocate Asaduzzaman said on Thursday.

On August 3, 2008, the caretaker government formed TAC under the ordinance promulgated by the then president on June 8 the same year. The tenure of the commission expired on January 2 last

Choudhury said Chidambaram has expressed keenness to visit Bangladesh as early as possible and date would be worked out through the diplomatic channel.

According to indications, the visit may take place after the budget session of Indian Parliament, which resumes yesterday and ends next

If materialises, this will be the first visit by Chidambaram

to Bangladesh as the home minister.

During the 15-minute meeting between Karim and Chidambaram at the North Block, the two discussed different bilateral issues particularly cooperation in security matters and terrorism.

Indian home Pro-BNP, Jamaat lawyers threaten to resist trial of war criminals

Pro-BNP and Jamaat lawyers at a seminar yesterday threatened to resist the trial of war criminals if it is carried out with 'political motive'.

They also said there is no need to hold such a trial as the main offenders -- 195 Pakistani soldiers -- had been released after the liberation

They termed the International War Crimes (Tribunals) Act 1973 a 'black' law and asked the government to bring necessary changes to the law to meet international standards.

They also demanded reconstitution of the tribunal and the prosecution team.

The National Forum for Protection of Human Rights, a pro-Jamaat platform, organised the seminar titled 'Legality of the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act 1973' at a city hotel.

Justice Abdur Rouf presided over the seminar while BNP chairperson's advisory council member Justice TH Khan and BNP standing committee member Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar attended the seminar as the chief guest and

special guest respectively. A huge number of BNP and Jamaat-backed lawyers were present.

Justice Abdur Rouf said, "There will be chaos if a farcical trial is held and you [government] will not be spared for that."

"Don't do anything that will put you on the dock," he told the tribunal formed to try war

Justice TH Khan said it would be a farce in the name of justice if the trial is held under the International Crimes (Tribunals) act 1973 as

each of its sections is full of blunder and does not conform to the international standard.

He alleged propaganda is being spread by using public sentiment regarding trial of war criminals.

Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar said there is no need to hold trial of war criminals as the main offenders, for whom the International Crimes (tribunals) Act 1973 was enacted, had been released.

The former speaker said justice will not be ensured if the law amended by the present parliament is not reviewed.

He also suggested abolishing death penalty. Supreme Court Bar Association President Khandaker Mahbub Hossain said no law can be more heinous than the International Crimes (Tribunals) (Amendment) Act 2009 as each of its provisions contradicts the rule of law.

"People and lawyers will resist if the trial is held with political motive," he warned the government and said abettors cannot be tried without ensuring the trial of main offenders.

Emphasising national consensus on the trial of war criminals, former vice chancellor of Dhaka University Prof Emajuddin Ahmed asked the government to reconstitute the tribunal and

the prosecution team. He also said the trial must be transparent and

acceptable to all. Jamaat-e-Islami Assistant Secretary General Barrister Abdur Razzak said they cannot imagine a darker law than the amended act to try war criminals.

BNP leaders Barrister Mahbubuddin Khokan MP, Advocate Zainul Abedin and Advocate Salaullah Mian also spoke.




