### Nasir A Choudhury

ORN in the Assam province of undivided India in December 1934, Nasir A Choudhury is the managing director and chief executive of Green Delta Insurance Company Ltd (GDIC).

After obtaining a master's degree from Dhaka University, he began his career as a management trainee at Pakistan Insurance Corporation on September 24, 1958. Later, he was posted at the insurer's regional office in Chittagong in 1964, after completing training at Eagle Star Insurance Company in London and Munich Reinsurance Company in Germany.

In 1985, when insurance was allowed in the private sector, he, along with some friends, who were mostly working abroad, floated Green Delta Insurance Company Ltd. It started operations on January 1,1986. It was the only company in Bangladesh that was floated and run by

professionals. In May 1973, Choudhury was appointed in-charge of underwriting and re-insurance of Sadharan Bima

mariner by education, Md Saiful Islam retired from his job at Bangladesh Shipping Corporation in 1986 to bet his fortunes on business.

The same year, he set up a small office at Motijheel in Dhaka to render technical services to ocean-going ships and supply spare parts for vessels. But the venture did not augur well initially.

It was the Gulf War of 1990 that presented a window of opportunity, as the turbulence shifted overhauling and technical works of ocean-going vessels to his company. He never looked back since then.

In 1990, Islam established Al-Islam Apparel Group under a joint venture. Seeking more value-added businesses, he established a German-Bangladesh joint venture, Picard (Bangladesh) Ltd, in 1997 to produce leather goods under the brand name of Picard.

It was in 1994 when Islam launched his most successful venture so far: shipbuilding. Western Marine Shipyard Ltd is one of the largest shipyards in Bangladesh. It began its own journey in 2000.

Persona, which since then has evolved into the country's largest beauty care company.

The brand ambassador for Sunsilk since 1991 and currently the same for Meril, Kaniz set up Persona Hair and Beauty Ltd at Dhanmondi in Dhaka in 1998.

The companies presently operating under the Persona brand name as private limited companies are Persona Hair and Beauty Ltd and Persona Beauty Care Ltd.

Under the leadership of Samson H Chowdhury, Square Pharma started its journey in 1958 under a partnership. Now, Tapan Chowdhury is the managing director of the concern that was registered as a private limited company in 1964 and converted to a public limited company in 1991.

It mainly produces active pharmaceutical ingredients, agro vets, pesticides, herbal and neutraceuticals. Tablets, capsules, liquids, ENT preparations, dry syrup, suppositories, inhalers, basic chemicals and aerosols are some of its products.

The company exports products to different countries, including those in Europe, Africa, South America and Asia, that accounted for \$5.5 million in export earnings in 2008-09.

## notice to Mahmudur by post

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) on Thursday decided to send a notice to Mahmudur Rahman, acting editor of the Amar Desh and former energy adviser, by post asking him to submit his wealth statement.

On April 13, the ACC had sent the notice to Mahmudur by hand, but he refused to receive it.

ACC sources said the notice

would be sent in a day or two.

The ACC decided to ask for the wealth statement of Mahmudur Rahman, as preliminary enquiry reveals that he possesses wealth beyond

known sources of income. In February, the ACC launched an enquiry into allegations of ill-gotten wealth against Mahmudur.

## Develop infrastructure to attract foreign investment

Says British envoy

It is imperative for Bangladesh to develop overall physical infrastructure including port, rail, road and shipping communications to attract foreign investment and achieve durable economic growth, British High Commissioner Stephen Evans observed.

He also said it would not be possible to accelerate industrialisation without desired development of the energy sector, including power and gas.

The British envoy said this during a meeting with Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) President MA Latif MP at the latter's office in the port city on Thursday evening.

Stephan Evans suggested introducing and implementing a congenial energy policy to attract foreign oil-gas exploration companies to ensure energy security. The overall development of the country would be seriously

hampered unless new gas fields are found here soon, he

observed. CCCI President MA Latif, also the local lawmaker of ruling Awami League, sought financial and technical assistance from the European Union, particularly the United Kingdom, for developing required infrastructure, including dedicated express highway, port and power plant.

# Project country's real history to students

### Nahid urges historians

Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid yesterday called on the historians and history teachers to prepare a proposal with recommendations to update the syllabuses of history at school and college level to project real history of the country to students.

prepare a proposal on various factors in teaching history, including syllabuses and problems faced by teachers, so that we can constitute a committee to resolve the prob-The minister said this as the chief guest at

"You [historians and history teachers]

a seminar on 'Studying history in college level: Problems and possibilities' organised by Government College History Teachers' Council at BMA auditorium in the city.

"With the real history of the country, we have to make our students proud and brave,' he added.

Nahid called for involvement of historians in preparing an effective proposal in this connection and said the ministry will provide all-out support to update history sylla-

Historian Muntasir Mamun said study of the country's history should be made compulsory in all disciplines, including science and commerce. "Why should the country and the govern-

ment help a student who does not know the history of his or her own country even after completing their education," questioned Muntasir, also a professor of history at Dhaka University.

The country has faced a number of problems, as history was not studied in all disciplines in the last 30 years, he opined. Speakers at the seminar said no nation

can reach its target until it places its real history before young people. The eventful history of the country's socio-cultural and political movements should be included in the history syllabuses at all levels of educa-

Prof Syed Anwar Hossain and Vice Chancellor of National University Dr Kazi Shahidullah also spoke.

### LEGAL NOTICE SERVED Govt asked to enforce House Rent

A human rights organisation served a legal notice asking the government to enforce the House Rent Control Act 1991 in order to prevent the house owners in the capital from arbitrarily collecting excess rent and advances from their tenants.

In the legal notice served on Thursday, the Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh (HRPB) also asked the government to execute the standard rent for premises fixed by Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) and to frame rules as per the act.

Secretaries to the cabinet division, secretariat of the prime minister's office, ministry of law, justice and parliamentary affairs, and the secretariat of the Jatiya Sangsad, and DCC mayor have been asked to reply to the legal notice within seven days.
