# RMG factory » vandalised for pay hike

Local gang loots garments for export; Cops among 40 hurt in clashes

Around 5,000 workers yesterday ransacked their garment factory, damaged at least 12 vehicles and clashed with police at Kanchpur that left 40 people, including 20 policemen, injured.

The workers of Esquire Knit Composite Ltd, a sister concern of Esquire Group, also barricaded the Dhaka-Sylhet Highway for about four hours demanding their salary hikes.

A local gang looted a huge quantity of readymade garments and other valuables from the factory taking opportunity of the unrest.

The workers ran amok at the factory at about 7:30 am and attacked its staff, said Mohammad Yunus, officer-in-charge of Sonargaon Police Station.

When police fired rubber bullets, teargas canisters and charged batons to disperse the agitating workers, they threw brickbats at the **SEE PAGE 15 COL 3**

## ADB to give \$1.8b

Padma Bridge, regional cooperation projects, PPP to get funds

Asian Development Bank will give \$1.8 billion or 40 percent of its total indicative plan for assistance in four years for construction of Padma Bridge, implementation of regional cooperation-related projects and public private partnership (PPP) initiatives.

This was proposed in a presentation made by the visiting ADB mission at a meeting with the government yesterday.

The presentation contained revised projectwise detailed programme for 2010 and proposed loan programme for 2011-13, meeting sources said.

The ADB mission proposed \$4.47 billion for four years, which include \$1.03 billion for the revised programme of 2010 and \$3.44 billon for 2011-13.

The government side at the meeting was led by ERD Secretary Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan and the ADB mission was led by Director General of ADB's South Asia Department Sultan Hafeez Rahman.

The ADB presentation emphasised regional cooperation and PPP as new areas. "To seize on the new opportunities opened up for regional cooperation and integration (RCI), ADB will seek to step up support for developing regional SEE PAGE 15 COL 6

## Jamaat readies alternative leadership

To replace some top leaders if arrested

Ignoring resentment in the party, Jamaat-e-Islami high-ups have agreed to replace high-ranking leaders of the party after the possible arrest of some of its leaders for their alleged involvement in war crimes in 1971. Sources said most of the leaders and workers of Jamaat and its

different front organisations are worried about possible arrest of all top leaders, which might create a serious vacuum and their absence may lead to desertion of Jamaat by field-level activists. Highly-placed sources said the party leaders are considering to

have a alternative leadership ready against whom there are no warcrime allegations so that they could run the party after the arrests. They said the party is passing its worst-ever time now after the Awami League government set up the International Crimes

Tribunal to try people involved in crimes against humanity committed during the Liberation War. Sources in Jamaat said the party high-ups were under the impression that the government would not be able to set up the

tribunal to try those people. After formation of the tribunal, party leaders seem very disorganised and many attempted to leave the country. Sources said majority of the young leaders and activists, espe-

cially those born a few years before and after the independence, SEE PAGE 15 COL 3


