39 canals meet » 1,000 grabbers

JS body asks DCs to serve notice on encroachers

In a major development, a parliamentary body yesterday asked Dhaka deputy commissioner's office to serve notices immediately on more than 1,000 individuals, organisations and establishments to dismantle the structures they had built encroaching on the city's 39 canals.

The parliamentary standing committee on land ministry also asked the land survey office to identify within seven days others who had grabbed the rest four canals -- Kalyanpur Khal, Baunia Khal, Ramchandrapur Khal and Begunbari Khal -- and serve them with notices as well.

"If the grabbers don't comply with the order within one and a half months, Dhaka Metropolitan Police, Dhaka City Corporation, Water Supply and Sewerage Authority, Deputy Commissioner's Office and other bodies concerned will launch a joint canal recovery operation," AKM Mozammel Huq, chief of the committee, told The Daily Star after a meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

Five killed as storm lashes Moulvibazar

At least five people were killed and 50 others injured as a devastating thunderstorm raged through different areas under Sadar upazila of the district Monday night.

The deceased were identified as Rushna, 35, her son Jewel, 10, of Oloha village, Amiruddin, 30, of Karimpur village, Nehar Begum, 42, of Halimpur village and Rakhal Debnath of Shairpur village of the district.

Of the five, three were killed when trees fell down on their tin-shed roofs and the rest were killed in thunderbolt.

More than 600 houses were damaged and 1,500 families affected by the storm.


Police Sub-inspector Gautam Roy, 42, died on the spot, and his hotelier friend Mohammad Shamim, 45, was wounded, after being shot near

Mohiuddin Market in Dholaikhal around 2:30am.

British firm to generate

The Power Development Board (PDB) yesterday initialled an unsolicited rental power contract with a British company to generate 200 megawatts of power.

According to the deal, 100MW of power would be generated within June 22 and the full-capacity production would be reached within July 28, sources said.

British company Aggreko, one of the world leaders in rental power, will install

ment in Ghorashal and Khulna or any other site designated by the government.

Meanwhile, the cabinet committee on economic affairs headed by the finance minister yesterday approved a proposal giving waiver from the Public Procurement Regulation (PPR) and Public Procurement Act (PPA) to procure urgent rental power of 1,000MW to 1,500MW without any tender.

Both PPR and PPA bar public procure-

ment without open tenders.

The deal with Aggreko was achieved following the country's fastest ever negotiation spearheaded by a high-powered committee led by Power Secretary AK Azad. Other members of the committee includes representatives of PDB, the National Board of Revenue, law ministry, power ministry and the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

Tahrir chief held

Remanded in 2 anti-terror cases

After six months of banning Islamist outfit Hizb ut-Tahrir Bangladesh for its anti-state activities, police arrested its chief coordinator Mahiuddin Ahmed yesterday from the capital on charges of plotting subversive and terrorist activities.

Mahiuddin, an associate professor of the Institute of Business Administration (IBA) of Dhaka University, was virtually under house arrest since October 22 when the government put a ban on his organisation.

But police rounded him up yesterday following some signifi-
