Commuter trains to link Dhaka with nearby dists

Says PM, opens Tejgaon link road

The government would take an initiative to introduce commuter train services between Dhaka and adjoining districts to improve the communications system in the capital.

Once launched, anybody from adjacent districts will be able to come to the capital and return the same day on commuter trains after the day's work, said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina after formally opening the Bijoy Sarani-Tejgaon Link Road yesterday. Hasina inaugurated the 1,114-metre-long and 60-foot-wide

road, which connects the Old Airport Road to Tajuddin Ahmed Sarani near Nabisco intersection. She said her previous government took an initiative to start the services and launched it in some districts including

Narayanganj and Brahmanbaria, but the four-party alliance government discontinued it. On recent power situation, Hasina said some officials and employees of DPDC and Desco are out to make a fast buck and destroy the image of the government through "false loadshedding". Ecnec okays revised power projects

Chandpur, Sylhet plants to generate 300MW by 2012

The Executive Committee of National Economic Council yesterday approved two revised power projects at Chandpur and Sylhet involving a cost of Tk 2,080 crore.

Two other projects costing Tk 520 crore were also approved by the Ecnec at a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

According to the revised time schedule, Chandpur and Sylhet plants are to start generating 150 megawatt power each by June 2012.

The government will have to spend an additional amount of Tk 1,353 crore for the two projects due to a delay of about 10 years in

implementing those. Originally the two projects were to cost Tk 728 crore, and those were approved in 2001.

Meeting sources quoted the prime minister as saying if the two projects were implemented in time, they would have saved the additional cost and added 300 MW power to the national

grid mitigating public sufferings. The Ecnec approved the Tk 1,201 crore project for construction of Chandpur 150 MW combined cycle power plant and associated

power evacuation facilities (2nd revised) project. The original project cost was Tk 386 crore, approved in April 2001.

The Ecnec meeting also okayed the Tk 878 crore project for building 150 MW combined cycle power plant in Sylhet as well as transmission system. The project was first approved in April 2001 with an estimated cost of Tk 342 crore, and it was to be completed by 2004.

According to a planning ministry report, the project was not implemented at that time as no

foreign aid agencies came forward. Later, it was decided that the project would

be implemented with suppliers' credit. But this time also the project sees complexity in getting suppliers' credit and delay in

inviting tenders, sources said. After assuming power, the present government took an initiative to implement the project, and the purchase committee approved

awarding contract to Chinese company Shanghai Electric Group Co Ltd. And in the case of Chandpur plant, despite approval by the purchase committee, work

order was not issued to the selected company.

Yesterday, the Ecnec approved a Tk 40 crore project titled Construction of Liquid Fuel System

for Sirajganj 150 MW Peaking Power Plant. Planning ministry sources noted that since

Procurement targets fixed for rice, paddy Prices raised

The government yesterday set a target to buy 11 lakh tonnes of rice at Tk 25 a kg and 1.5 lakh tonnes of paddy at Tk 17 per kg

in the upcoming Boro season. The procurement will start from May 1 and continue up to August 31, Food and Disaster Management Minister Abdur Razzaque told reporters after a meeting of the Food Planning and Monitoring Unit at the food ministry.

Last year the public procurement rate of rice was Tk 22 a kg.

"We have increased the procurement rate considering the high rice prices in the international market and ensuring farmers' profit. If farmers get good price, they will produce more crops," the minister said.

Stressing the need for more stock to face natural disasters, Razzaque said the government

Milk Vita sales boss suspended

Nanak passes the order at meeting

At a meeting in presence of officials and the media, the state minister for LGRD and cooperatives ordered the suspension of the marketing manager of Milk Vita in connection with corruption, mismanagement and irregularities. State minister Jahangir Kabir Nanak gave the order at the

meeting held at his ministry yesterday against manager (marketing) Bidyut Kumar Mandol of Bangladesh Milk Producers Cooperative Union Ltd, widely known as Milk Vita. Bidyut was present at the meeting among other top officials of MilkVita. Bidyut was suspended as he failed to deliver satisfactory

answer to the state minister about mismanagement in milk distribution, MilkVita officials told The Daily Star.

Three new distributors of the milk vita drew attention of the state minister to "the manager not delivering their required milk on time". He always intentionally delays milk supplies, General Secretary of Digital Plus Multipurpose Cooperative Society Anisur Rahman told the state minister in the meeting.

Digital Plus Multipurpose Cooperative Society is one of the three distributors.

He also said the manager did not supply necessary amount of milk every day. The manager gives them only 3,000 to 5,000 litres a day but they were supposed to get 7,000 litres. Moreover, the manager does not receive their phone calls.

As Nanak asked about these mismanagements, Bidyut told him that he remains busy with meetings and this is why he failed to receive the new distributors' phone calls. As the minister SEE PAGE 15 COL 6

Budget likely to be placed June 10

The budget for fiscal year 2010-11 might be placed in the Jatiya Sangsad on June 10, Finance Minister AMA Muhith said yesterday. After a pre-budget discus-

sion with the ministries at the Finance Division under the non-medium term budgetary framework, Muhith said the budget session of parliament may start on June 3.

The minister also said all ministries and departments would be brought under the MTBF from the next fiscal year. Presently, 32 ministries and departments are under it.

The ministries and departments would be given resource packages for five years under the MTBF. They will prepare a list of projects and take initiatives to implement those according to the list of priorities, he noted.

The number of projects under the annual development programme should be reduced, he said.

No classes at CU, BCL men torch teachers' bus

Academic activities of Chittagong University could not be resumed yesterday due to violent protest during the indefinite strike programme of Bangladesh Chhatra League. Meanwhile, BCL activists set fire to a teachers' bus of CU near

Sholoshahar area in the morning and also halted the movement

of university bound shuttle trains and public vehicles to resist the students from going to the campus. Police in separate drives in the city yesterday arrested eight BCL activists in connection with setting the teachers' bus ablaze. Panchlaish police arrested six persons--Rubel, Ershad,

Khorshed Alam, Nizamul Alam, Subal Das and Nur Mohammad while Khulshi police arrested Alauddin and Anwar Hossain. Assistant Commissioner of Police Rezaul Masud said four of the arrestees were activists of BCL CU unit while others were of

BCL city unit. Witnesses said a group of BCL men torched the bus near Baby Super Market at about 6:30am. On information, fire fighters rushed in and doused the flame.

BCL on Friday called the strike at CU protesting the death of their activist Asaduzzaman, a second-year student of Accounting Department, on April 16, who was allegedly stabbed by neighbouring villagers following an altercation at Pahela Baishakh festival Thursday night.

The CU authorities yesterday were set to resume academic activities after suspending all classes and exams for three days since April 17 following the death of Asaduzzaman. The demonstrators halted movement of shuttle trains at the

Chittagong Railway Station to press home their five-point demand including resignation of the vice-chancellor and the proctor of the university for their failure to give security to the students.
