

6-month maternity leave proposed for public sector

The Ministry of Women and Children Affairs has proposed fully paid maternity leave for six months instead of four months for the women in government services.

Laila Jesmin, deputy secretary (administration) of the women and children affairs ministry, on Wednesday told The Daily Star, "We have already sent the proposal to the Finance Division to issue notification."

The Finance Division will hold a meeting next week in this regard.

Laila said this initiative would help improve the country's malnutrition status of children, as the mother will be able to breast-feed her baby for six months after birth.

Child experts suggest breast-feeding for six months, which has many advantages to the infant's health and can save them from early illness and death.

Now, women are entitled to four-month maternity leave and they get this opportunity for two times.

However, in private sectors including garment factories, a large number of women are working without getting any maternity leave.

So, the women rights activists demand that the maternity leave be given in all sectors and that will contribute to women empowerment.

Dr Maleka Banu, general secretary of Bangladesh Mahila Parishad, said the government should enforce the rule of six months' maternity leave in all sectors to ensure child and mother care.

There are many sectors where women are working without maternity leave benefits, and, in some cases, they lose their jobs after they conceive, she added.

Prof Fatima Parveen Chowdhury, director of Institute of Public Health and Nutrition, said, "If a mother does not get a six-month leave, she may deprive her baby of breast feeding which is a must for mental and physical growth of a child".

She also said the government would enforce the rule to fight against children's malnutrition. The rate of children suffering from malnutrition is still high in the country, she noted.

Female labour force in urban areas comes to 28 lakh while it is 93 lakh in rural areas. They are mainly working in readymade garment industry, pottery, agriculture and different small industries, according to the Bangladesh Labour Force Survey.

TU leaders demand Tk 5,000 national minimum wage

Trade union leaders yesterday demanded that the government fix the national minimum wage at Tk 5,000 given the rising prices of most essentials and services that had left the lower income groups in trouble in the recent years.

They were speaking at a roundtable titled "National minimum wage should not be fixed at a level lower than poverty line" organised by Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad at Dhaka Reporters' Unity in the capital.

"The labour force in the country is passing through a critical time as prices of essentials have gone up several times but their wage has not increased accordingly," said Roy Ramesh Chandra, general secretary of Jatiya Sramik League.

He presented the keynote paper at the discussion.

New intelligence unit of BDR in the offing

Three wings of the agency to have 2,700 members

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) authorities have finalised formation of its new full-fledged intelligence agency with three wings--Border Security Bureau (BSB), Regional Intelligence Bureau (RIB) and Unit Intelligence Branch (UIB).

About 67 officers will lead the three wings with the help of about 2,700 members, sources in the paramilitary border force said.

Twenty percent of the officers will be recruited from civilians while 30 percent from retired army officers and the rest 50 percent from serving army officers, the organogram of the agency says.

The aspirants for civilian posts must have a

Master's degree. They will take a six-month course on physical training and administrative functioning and then go to the Military Intelligence (MI) for training on intelligence activities.

"Half of the members of the intelligence agency will be recruited from civilians while the rest from the existing BDR soldiers," a BDR official involved in the formation process told The Daily Star vesterday.

He said BSB will have 765 members to be headed by a colonel. The RIB will work in all the seven divisions and UIB in each BDR battalion under the leadership of a brigadier general and a major respectively. One unit of RIB will be

BCL men block highway after Ruet clash

Bangladesh Chhatra League activists of Rajshahi University of Engineering and Technology (Ruet) barricaded the Dhaka-Rajshahi highway for over three and a half hours on Thursday night.

Over 300 activists put up a barricade in front of the institute around 10:00pm, protesting the arrest of two of their men following a factional clash. The traffic movement remained halted in the area.

They also burned logs and banners of other parties during the protests.

4 killed in road crashes

Four people were killed and another was injured in separate road accidents in Narsingdi Chapainawabganj yesterday.

UNB reports: Three people were killed and another was injured in a road accident at Chaytabo in Narsingdi Sadar.

Two of the dead were identified as Montu Mia, 50, and Aminur Rahman, 35, but the identity of the other could not be known immediately.

Police said two passengers and another unidentified driver of a CNG-run taxi died on the spot as a bus rammed into the taxi while overtaking a truck at about 5:15pm.
