Govt eyes more coal for power

PM asks for assessment on electricity prospect from Barapukuria mine; wants unsolicited power deals in public interest

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday advocated for open pit coal mining in Barapukuria, and instructed the power ministry to assess how much power could be generated from that

At a cabinet meeting, she hinted at the oil, gas and port protection committee's resistance to open pit mining, and said her government is ing. not concerned about "others' criticism". The committee vehemently campaigns against open pit mining, saying it is environmentally disastrous.

Hasina is in favour of a balanced approach for tapping the largely unutilised coal resources. A cabinet member quoted the prime

minister as saying, "We are concerned about what would benefit us the most, and how much would it affect the environment."

"Some people suggest it is possible to set up power plants of 10,000 megawatt capacity, some suggest it could be of 15,000 megawatt. The power ministry may make a presentation on exactly what could be done with the Barapukuria coal," the PM was quoted as say-


Another cabinet member told The Daily Star, the PM is likely to carry out a major reshuffle of all government power agencies very soon to ensure higher efficiency. She feels that many officials are unproductive and unable to give decisions, and they must go.

Govt asked to form teams to end illegal power use

The High Court (HC) yesterday directed the government to form a vigilance team in each city corporation to snap all unauthorised power connections to shops, markets and commercial organisations to stop illegal use and misuse of electricity.

It asked the government to form the team with members of law enforcement agencies, and to submit to it reports on their actions within 30 days.

The HC also ordered a probe into the reported allegation against the deputy commissioner of Rangpur about his playing lawn tennis by using floodlights.

Anti-graft body to be kept under control

Cabinet okays proposals for restricting ACC's freedom

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) would be obliged to take permission from the government prior to initiating a case against any government officials.

This was approved by the cabinet yesterday amid debates triggered by a set of amendment proposals submitted in March last year by a government-formed committee.

The anti-graft watchdog would now also be accountable to the president and would not

remain self-governed anymore.

The cabinet approved the amendments ignoring the anti-graft body's cautions in the last few months that those would mainly diminish its independence and impartial functioning.

The ACC commissioners including its Chairman Ghulam Rahman even met the law minister to request him not to bring the amendments saying those would hamper independent functioning of the commission.
