Govt to make list public in a week

At least 1,000 non-government educational institutions will get monthly pay order (MPO) facilities as the government will publish a list of the institutions within a week giving the lower secondary and secondary schools priority over colleges.

The ministry will publish the list within a week from over 7,500 applications submitted for MPO, said Education Minister Nurul Islam Nahid vesterday.

scrutiny for giving the institutions monthly pay adding many institutions may not fulfil the order facilities, he told reporters at his secretariat in the city.

"We will put the list on the website as well," the minister added.

He, however, did not mention the possible numbers of schools, madrasas, colleges and technical institutions to be entitled to MPO. But the highly placed sources at the ministry hinted that the number of institutions could be between 1,000 and 1,100.

Under the MPO, teachers and employees will get cent percent basic salaries and other benefits from the government.

The MPO has been withheld since 2004 following allegations of corruption and nepotism in the process. After assuming office, the government formed a committee to devise a policy for the MPO.

The ministry sources said the institutions from Dhaka, Chittagong and Sylhet will be enrolled mostly this time as fewer institutions in these areas were included in MPO system last

The institutions having government's approval after January 2008 will not be included in the list this time, they added.

The finance ministry had recommended listing 1,000 institutions last year when it gave the allocation for MPO. The number of institutions recommended

A high-level committee is making a final by the finance ministry may change, Nahid said criteria for MPO inclusion.

He also said they had prepared MPO guidelines after reviewing proposals of different ministries and the prime minister's office.

The list will be made based on the guidelines, he said.

Asked about pressure from the lawmakers, he said they will not recommend any institution going beyond the guidelines.

The ministry sources said lower secondary The government has allocated Tk 112 crore and secondary schools will get priority as their staff number is small.

The ministry will send a proposal to the finance ministry requesting them to allocate more money in the coming budget for MPO inclusion, they added.

Sources said a huge number of teachers are lobbying for enrolment under the MPO for the last few days that prompted the MPO listing

300MW RENTAL POWER

2 more unsolicited deals under process

STAR REPORT

The power ministry today seeks the cabinet purchase committee's approval for two unsolicited rental power deals involving 300 megawatt -- one with an experienced British company and the other with a local company having negligible experience.

The ministry had earlier initialled contracts with British Aggreko for installing 200 MW power units in Khulna and Ashuganj, and with local Desh Energy for a 100 MW unit in Siddhirganj by July-August for three years. The plants would operate on diesel.

Besides, the power ministry has agreed to a proposal from local firm Summit Power to increase production capacity of its 110 MW Khulna barge mounted power plant by 100 MW for five years.

The ministry sealed these deals following the prime minister's nod for allowing unsolicited power contracts to reduce the persisting load shedding in the shortest possible time. The premier also formed a high-powered interministerial committee to expedite the process.

Initially, the ministry invited power companies that have a minimum experience of

Ikramul said the Greece-based shipping company's agent in Benin, however, did not pay salaries to the sailors though it earlier promised to do so.

Police disclose identity of 3 bodies found buried on Turag bank

The three bodies, recovered on the bank of the Turag River on Tuesday, are of a Juba Dal leader and his two bodyguards, police said yesterday.

They were identified as Mizanur Rahman, Juba Dal president of Sakoria union in Jhalakathi, and his bodyguards Forkan Ahmed of Rajapur upazila in Jhalakathi, and Nazmul Huq Murad of Kaukhali in Pirojpur. Police said the three were on the run for the last few months

as they had been accused in several murder and extortion cases filed with different police stations in Dhaka, Jhalakathi, Pirojpur and Khulna.

Navy personnel arrested Mizan with firearms in 1995 after a gunfight with a pirate gang in the Sundarbans. He was a member of the gang at that time.

Mizan was later released from Khulna jail on a High Court bail. Shamsul Huq, officer-in-charge of Rajapur Police Station, said Mizan was a listed criminal and accused in six cases on various charges including murder, extortion and assault on

police. "He was involved in arms smuggling and drug peddling in Jhalakathi. Forkan was his associate and an accused in several

cases," Shamsul said. Sources said Mizan, Murad and Forkan came to Dhaka after the last caretaker government assumed power and got involved in criminal activities.

Suicide car bomb kills 4 Pak cops

A suicide car bomb attack hit a Pakistani police checkpoint on the outskirts of Peshawar before dawn yesterday, killing four police and wounding 11 people, including a woman and a cleric. Northwest Pakistan is on the front line of the

country's battle against Taliban and al-Qaedalinked militants holed up in the tribal belt on the Afghan border which is subject to Pakistani military operations and US drone attacks.

More than 50 bomb attacks have struck the nuclear-armed country so far this year, killing around 500 people, and a string of deadly attacks this month have been largely concentrated in the northwest.

Wednesday's attacker struck the checkpoint in Pir Bala village, on the main road from Peshawar, Pakistan's north-western capital, to Mohmand, one of seven districts in the al-Qaeda and Taliban-infested tribal belt.
