

Barcelona have reached a verbal agreement to sign Valencia's Spanish international striker David Villa, the top scorer at Euro 2008, sports daily Marca reported Friday.

The deal, which will be made official once the current Spanish league season ends, will be worth over 40 million euros and could include Barcelona pair Alex Hleb and Bojan Krkic, the newspaper said without citing sources.

Villa, who is the third top scorer in La Liga with 21 goals, had been coveted last year by both Barcelona and archrivals Real Madrid.

But the Catalan club finally secured the services of Swedish striker Zlatan Ibrahimovic from Inter Milan in a deal which saw Cameroon striker Samuel Eto'o move to the Italian side.

Wayne Rooney has completed an awards double after being voted the English Footbal Writers' Association (FWA) player of the year. Rooney, 24, claimed 81 per-

cent of the votes cast to follow up an equally convincing win in the ballot for the Professional Footballer's Association player of the year award. FWA chairman Steve Bates

said Rooney's dominance of the voting reflected the huge impact he has had for United in the wake of Cristiano Ronaldo's departure for Real Madrid, which has resulted in Champions League finals him being deployed as an outand-out striker. "His tally of 34 goals so far

this season is certain to have captured the attention of our members, but I am sure the overall improvement in his game at Manchester United has been of equal significance," said Bates.
