Flyover to end Kuril's jam woes

Hopes PM as she opens construction

The three-kilometre Kuril Interchange at the intersection of Airport Road and Progoti Sarani will significantly ease up the capital's traffic congestion, said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina while inaugurating the construction yesterday.

The interchange, popularly known as Kuril flyover, will have six ramps ensuring free flow of traffic from Purbachal New Town, airport, Mohakhali, Banani and Rampura to pass over the railway level-crossing and an intersection at Kuril.

University of Engineering and Technology, who was involved with the layout configuration of the facility, said it is an interchange to ensure uninterrupted traffic movement at the intersection. An interchange is a road junction that uses

grade separation, and one or more ramps, to permit traffic on at least one highway to pass through the junction without directly crossing any other traffic stream.

Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) Chairman Md Nurul Huda at the inauguration said Kuril level-crossing halts vehicles at least 60 times every day causing four hours' delay in traffic movement at that point.

The interchange will relieve the city com-Lengths of the six ramps together make the muters of the suffering due to congestion at Airport Road-Progoti Sarani intersection and save time. It will be the fourth entry route to the capital and facilitate access from northeastern districts, he added.

1 ship with stranded crew brought to Benin coast

The seamen stranded offshore Benin started coming to mainland of the West African country, said a foreign ministry official yesterday.

"One ship was brought to the shore yesterday but it could not be known how many seamen were on it," said Saida Muna Tasneem, director general of the external publicity wing of the foreign affairs ministry.

According to earlier information, there were 27 seamen on board the eight ships. Another ship was traced having two more seamen aboard bringing the total to 29, she said. These ships are around ten

Jamaat has to amend charter by this month

The Election Commission has decided to ask Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami to amend some provisions in its charter that do not conform to the country's constitution and the RPO and submit the corrected charter by May 31.

The amendments to Jamaat's aim and objectives and a few provisions in its charter are required to retain the party's registration with the EC.

The commission had sent letters twice to Jamaat since this January without specifying any timeframe for completing the task. But the party did not respond to any of the letters, a senior EC official said.

"Under such circumstances, the commission has decided to give the party a deadline to do it," he told The Daily Star yesterday. Another EC official said the letter would be sent to the party today or tomorrow.

power project, the PDB received one dozen bids, mostly from foreign companies. A similar number of bids was submitted in the tender for 150

to 220 MW gas-fired Bhola power project.

The tender for Saidpur 100 MW dual fuel power project drew eight bidders.

3 clubs asked to stop use of floodlights for playing

The High Court yesterday directed the authorities of Dhaka Club, Uttara Club and Officers Club to impose restriction on playing at the clubs by using floodlights for three months from now.

The court ordered the managing directors (MDs) of Dhaka Electric Supply Company Ltd (Desco) and Dhaka Power Distribution Company (DPDC) to ensure compliance with its order within seven days, and submit to it a report in this regard within 30 days.

Upon a writ petition, an HC bench also issued a rule on the government to explain why its inaction in preventing misuse of electricity should not be declared illegal.
