Robbers stab expat

UNB, Sylhet

Robbers looted valuables from an expatriate's house injuring him seriously at Noarai village in Biswanath upazila early Tuesday. Police quoting locals said, a gang of armed robbers numbering 10/12 stormed into the house of Birendra Das, a Bahrain expatriate, late at night breaking open the door and looted 15 tolas of gold ornaments, Tk 30,000 in cash and other valuables. The robbers at one stage stabbed Birendra indiscriminately when he tried to resist them. The victim was admitted to Sylhet Osmani Medical College and Hospital in critical condition.

Bus strike in Sherpur

An indefinite bus strike called by Sherpur Inter-district Transport Workers Union here Tuesday continued for second day yesterday causing immense suffering to the commuters. Bus communication in 11 internal routes in five upazilas remained cut-off due to the strike. According to the sources, the transport workers union stopped plying of buses on April 27 as its Sherpur branch secretary Shawkat Hossain was assaulted by a CNG-run auto-rickshaw driver in Nouhata area. However, they resumed service after three hours following the assurance of police officials that they would take proper action in this regard. As no action was taken, the transport workers enforced fresh strike on Monday demanding punishment to CNG-run auto-rickshaw driver responsible for the attack.

Union leader held with pistol

A leader of a transport workers union was held along with a pistol and six bullets while he took shelter at a house in Chairman Road area of the district town after firing two shots targeting the son of a state minister Tuesday evening. The arrestee was identified as Kamal Hossain. Police quoting locals said while Sohel Sarkar, son of State Minister for Youths and Sports Ahad Ali Sarkar, was going to his town's residence from nearby Harispur area along with some ruling party workers at 7:00pm, Kamal fired two shots targeting him. But Sohel narrowly escaped unhurt.

Case against CPB men dismissed

A speedy trial court yesterday dismissed a case against 20 leaders and activists of Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) Gaibandha filed by Sadar Upazila Jubo League. According to the prosecution of the case, on June 25, 2009 a clash ensued between the activists of CPB and AL at Dariyapur under Gaibandha Sadar over holding a public meeting there. Sohel Mia, an activist of Jubo League filed a case against 20 CPB leaders and activists including district CPB secretary Mihir Ghosh. The CPB secretary and some others were arrested by police and later released on bail.

River transport workers threaten non-stop strike

River transport workers have threatened indefinite strike from Friday midnight if their 22-point demand including new pay scale is not met by

On March 15 the workers realise their demands. However, they called off the work stoppage following an understanding reached at a tripartite meeting between representatives of the govern-

ment, owners and workers on he added. March 18.

Vessel Workers Federation Abul Kashem Master said it was agreed at the meeting that a uniform pay scale for all workers based on national pay scale-2009 will be went on a non-stop strike to announced and implemented by April 30.

Although the representatives of the government and owners held meetings four times since then, they failed to announce the new pay scale,

Another meeting between Joint secretary of the the government and vessel owners is scheduled to be held today.

Kashem said if the meeting fails to produce any positive result, they will be compelled to go for indefinite strike across the country from Friday midnight.

To realise the demands, the river transport workers enforced indefinite work stoppage five times in the last two years.

17 Bangladeshis handed over by Indian police

Indian police on Tuesday afternoon returned 17 Bangladeshi citizens to immigration police at Burimari land port in Patgram upazila.

Officer-in-charge (OC) of Mekhliganj police station in Kuchbihar district of West Bengal Joydev Saha handed them over to Burimari Immigration police SI Abdullah Hil Kafi at zero point.

Indian Border Security Force and Bangladesh Border Guard members were present on the occasion.

Of the 17 Bangladeshis, seven were identified as Hafizul Islam, 25, Rashidul Haque, 36, Atoar Rahman, 30, Anowarul, 26, Maniruzzaman,28, Abu Ali,26, and Rubel,23.

They hail from different villages of Patgram upazila in Lalmonirhat while the rest 10 are from different districts, immigration police said.

Ban on jatka catching extended for a month

The government has extended the ban on catching jatka (hilsa fry less than nine inches) for one more month in the 60-kilometre stretch of the Meghna in Chandpur.

District Fisheries Officer Qazi Iqbal Hossain said though the two-month-long jatka protection programme ended on April 30, the restriction on catching hilsa fry will

The fishermen can catch all kinds of fish except Jatka during the period, he added. Making a long stretch of the

Meghna in Chandpur sanctuary for hilsa, the jatka protection programme has been observing since 2006. As per the programme, the government imposes a ban on fishing jatka in the river in March-April every year

The fishermen in the area who have been provided with food support and financial assistance in the last two months will receive rice in May as well.
