Govt moves to offset crop losses

CPD holds discussion on climate-resilient agriculture

Farmers lost some 1.56 lakh tonnes of Boro rice in the haor areas because of the recent flash floods, said Agriculture Minister Matia Chowdhury yesterday.

In a bid to help offset the losses, the government has allocated Tk 26 crore to encourage farmers to grow highyielding rice during the current Aus season by providing them with certain amount of fertiliser for free.

"We hope such supports will help them recover," the minister said.

Flash floods in the haor areas of greater Sylhet have damaged standing Boro crops on around 40,000 hectares of land, Matia said emerging from the inauguration of a two-day international workshop on 'building climate resilient agriculture in Asia' at Brac Centre Inn in Dhaka.

Local research organisation Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD), India-based International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics and the Asian Development Bank co-organised the event.

Around 45 participants from Bangladesh, China, India, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam attended the programme.

They focused on research findings on various countries including Bangladesh relating to climate change and its impact on agriculture and food security.

Chaired by CPD Chairman Prof Rehman Sobhan, the event was addressed by former adviser to caretaker government AMM Shawkat Ali, among others.

"We are frequently facing floods, cyclones, droughts and riverbank erosion. The impact of such disasters on agriculture is getting conspicuous," said Matia.

The minister vented frustration over excessive use of underground water.

"The issue of rainwater conservation was neglected also. Depending on underground water seems to be a panacea," said Matia.

"Over-mining of underground water has not only created arsenic problem but also caused desertification in the northern region as water level depleted."

She said the government gives priority to using surface water to limit the use of underground water and reduce arsenic in crops and food sources.

Three saline-resistant varieties of crops have already been developed to fight the impact of climate change, the minister added.

"We need to develop more varieties with higher tolerable level. Short-duration crop and drought-tolerant variety should also be developed," said Matia.

CPD Chairman Rehman Sobhan said institutional arrangements should be in place to combat the impacts of climate change.

Citing a study on Bangladesh, he said the impact of climate change has already been felt. He said most farmers in Bangladesh operate smallholdings and their needs should be addressed.

AMM Shawkat Ali said public health and food security will equally be vulnerable to climate change. He stressed the need for attaining food-autarky.

Vehicle trackers win urban hearts

The vehicle tracking system (VTS) has helped retrieve about a dozen covered vans and goods trucks stolen on different highways since the introduction of the technology in Bangladesh in June 2009.

The use of VTS also gained popularity among car users in metropolitan cities, by which owners can check on the routes taken by their drivers.

"We helped the police recover five stolen covered vans and one taxi in the last six months by locating the vehicles," Gorky Sobhan, a director of Monico Ltd, told The Daily Star.

Two other VTS providers -- Nexdecade Technolofies (Pvt) Ltd, NITS Service (Pvt) Ltd -also helped the police track stolen cars.

A vehicle tracking system entails an electronic device installed in a vehicle to enable the owner or a third party to track the vehicle's location. In Bangladesh, most vehicle tracking systems use global positioning system (GPS) modules to accurately locate a vehicle.

Three operators have so far sold a total of 6,000 VTS devices. Eighty percent of these devices were sold to corporate users.

"Users also take advantage of the technology to manage their fleet to save traffic hours and dictate right direction to their drivers," Gorky added.

NITS Service Private Ltd is taking the lead in sales

with approximately 3,000 devices sold by April 2010. NITS established dominance in the market as it sold VTS devices on bank credit.

"Most of our commercial vans are equipped with VTS. We are getting positive responses from customers as we have information that some customers successfully recovered their stolen vans," said Tanmoy Kumar Saha, sales and marketing executive of NITS Service.

Only four organisations -- Grameenphone, Monico Ltd, NITS Service and Nexdecade Technologies Ltd -- have so far received licences from Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission to provide VTS.

Technology (Pvt) Ltd, said the local vehicle trackers now provide services such as engine lock, door lock, mileage detection and fuel consumption. He said the module is installed at a cost of Tk

12,000 with a Tk 6,000 to Tk 7,000 annual maintenance cost, which is similar to the price charged by other service providers. Vehicle theft is common to Dhaka. According

to Dhaka Metropolitan Police, more than 50 cases on average are filed in Dhaka city a month for carjacks.

With the tracker in place, the police can locate the stolen vehicle by simply following the signal emitted by the system.

Currently, 24 mutual funds with their combined issued capital of around Tk 1,000 crore are traded on bourses.

Illegal VoIP faces a block

Four mobile operators have signed up for a system that can automatically detect illegal international call termination powered by voice over internet protocol (VoIP).

The system, already set up on the Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (BTRC) premises, will help both the telecoms regulator and the operators to detect the mobile numbers that will be used for illegal call termination.

Four operators -- Grameenphone, Banglalink, Warid Telecom and Citycell -yesterday connected themselves to SIM Box Detection system that is based on a call method and uses many different routes to provide results with accuracy. A box contains 10-30 SIMs (sub-

scriber identity modules) that operators can use for illegal call termination and the system will detect any such routing.

(Amended), now under review, has kept a provision of imposing Tk 300 crore fine, if any operator's involvement is found in such illegal call termination.

Around 60 million minutes of international calls are made to and from Bangladesh a day. Of those, more than 30 percent calls are terminated through illegalVoIP operators.

In Bangladesh, call termination through VoIP has become a lucrative business as the technology offers international calls at charges much lower than those of the legal calls.

Meucci Solutions, a Belgian company that has developed the system, will monitor the call status and provide reports to the BTRC and operators on a daily basis.

Based on the reports, the operators will block the SIMs used for illegal call termination and the BTRC will take nation.

BTRC Chairman Zia Ahmed said: "The new system will help reduce illegal VoIP calls. But this is not enough to totally stop illegal call termination." The system will automatically

detect the fraud calls and inform both the operators and regulator, said Zakiul Islam, president of Association of Mobile Telecom Operators of Bangladesh.

"It will make the industry more compliant.'

Hummer recalls 198,000 H3s

General Motors said Wednesday that it is recalling all Hummer H3s produced since the 2006 model year to fix a portion of the hood that can detach during driv-

The voluntary recall affects 164,190 Hummer H3s and H3Ts in the US and 198,404 worldwide.

Hummer spokesman Nick Richards said a device on the hood called a hood louver can come loose and possibly detach while driving.
