Go strict against BCL crimes

Home ministry asks cops, warns of disciplinary actions for failure; police high-ups to act 'professionally'

The home ministry has asked police officials to act strictly to curb crimes by Chhatra League activists or face disciplinary measures.

Water vessels strike begins

Workers reject new wage structure

Bangladesh Noujan Sramik Federation called an indefinite strike from midnight rejecting the new wage structure announced yesterday for water transport workers.

As per the new structure, wages of the workers have been raised by 50 to 100 percent, which makes the minimum salary of a worker Tk 2,850. But the workers earlier demanded Tk 5,000 as the minimum wage.

Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan announced the salary structure at a press briefing held at Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) conference room yesterday.

Delay for faulty design

Tongi overpass is complete 2 years past deadline

Overshooting the deadline by two years, the newly constructed Tongi overpass is a classic example of how development projects are delayed for bad designs and lack of foresight, ultimately taking a heavy toll on the people.

The overpass on Dhaka-Kaliganj-Ghorashal-Pachdona Road over the Tongi level crossing is a major initiative to ease daily horrible traffic congestion on the road that connects the northern and southern regions of the

country bypassing the capital. Hundreds of vehicles clog the

entire Tongi area round the clock now because traffic halts at the crossing repeatedly. Uncountable work hours are also lost in the jams. On top of that, during the pro-

longed period of construction, local residents and traders choked with dust from the construction site. Around 5,500 vehicles use the road

everyday, said Sub-assistant Engineer of Roads and Highway Department of Tongi Division Kazi Nazrul Islam.

Seventy two trains pass by the level

crossing everyday, for which road traffic must be stopped on both sides of the crossing for about 12 hours a day, he added saying, the situation will hugely improve after the overpass opens. It is now expected to be inaugurated by the prime minister soon, he said.

The work started in March 2006 and was supposed to be completed within the next two years. But the contractor could not complete it on time due to 14 months' work suspension, as the design of the overpass was changed twice, he said.

Junior schools get

Govt selects 1,022 non-govt educational institutions for the facility

The government yesterday listed 1,022 new non-government secondary and higher secondary educational institutions for receiving its monthly pay order (MPO) facilities.

The list of schools, colleges, technical institutions and madrasas, which came six years after the annual scheme had been suspended, was posted on the education ministry website (www.moedu.gov.bd) around 4:00am yesterday.

The ministry gave priority to junior schools while preparing the list.

Of the 1,022 institutions, 228 are junior schools, 204 secondary schools, 14 institutions having both school and college sections, 50 higher secondary colleges, 18 degree colleges,

163 dakhil madrasas, 27 alim madrasas, six fazil madrasas, 151 vocational institutions and 161 business management colleges.

Teachers and employees appointed in these institutions as per rules will receive full basic salaries and other benefits from the government from January 1 this year, said an official handout.

Education ministry sources, however, said the ministry will first scrutinise the appointments of these teachers and employees.

The Directorate of Secondary and Higher Education will carry out the next steps for implementing the MPO.

The government allocated Tk 112.35 crore for MPO for this fiscal year.

government. On this day in 2007, Hasina returned home overcoming the 'restrictions' imposed by the caretaker government.

WAR CRIMES TRIAL

PMO to deal with recruitment in probe agency

The Prime Minister's Office is now dealing with the appointments of war crimes probe body members to avoid further controversy.

The PMO itself will finalise the names of the investigators

after careful scrutiny, said government high officials. Controversies arose in recent days over a few appointments at the prosecution panel and investigation agency, both formed on March 25 to work for the International Crimes Tribunal Act, to

the embarrassment of the government. Recommendations by home, law and liberation war affairs ministries and some influential officials at the PMO were the yardsticks to set these two high profile bodies.

The government earlier dropped appointments of two ruling party lawmakers -- Nurul Islam Sujan and Sanjida Khanam -from the prosecution panel and so far appointed six persons as prosecutors.

The government has decided to appoint more investigators including a probe body chief in the wake of the resignation of chief investigator Abdul Matin.

Youth stabbed dead in Sylhet

A day after the clash between two BNP factions in Sylhet city, one of the factions yesterday claimed the dead who succumbed to his stab injuries at Osmani Medical College
