



First death anniversary of Dr Wazed Miah today

Today is the first death anniversary of Dr MA Wazed Miah, an eminent scientist and the husband of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

He passed away on this day last year at the Square Hospital in the city after a prolonged battle with multiple illnesses.

Dr Wazed was an internationally renowned nuclear scientist and a former chief of Bangladesh Atomic Energy

Commission. He authored many books, including 'Fundamentals of Thermodynamics' and 'Fundamentals of Electromagnetics', and obtained PhD degree from the Imperial College in London. He got married to Hasina in

Born on February 16, 1942 at Fatehpur village of Pirganj upazila in Rangpur, Dr Wazed was the youngest among four brothers and three sisters.


