Partial strike continues on riverways

The indefinite water transport strike was partially observed yesterday, as some vessels continued to ply ignoring the strike enforced by the workers Friday midnight.

The strike disrupted movement of imported goods through Chittagong Port as the lighter vessels, that ferry cargoes from ships in the outer anchorage to the jetties and other destinations, remained stranded.

Besides, use of force by proruling party workers on their pro-strike counterparts left at least five people injured in Chittagong and several others manhandled in Dhaka.

Yunus sings for social business

Calls for creating a different world

Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus has called for establishing social business as a problem solver, not profit maximiser, to tackle global poverty and social injustice.

"If we had created another kind of business on the basis of selflessness, we could have created a different kind of world," said Yunus, the founder of Grameen Bank, yesterday.


He was giving a lecture on "Creating a world without poverty-- social business bridging the gap" at the inaugural session of a three-day international conference.

Yunus said selfishness is at the heart of business that has created a string of socio-economic problems across the globe.

North South University, US-based Knowledge Globalization Institute and Suffolk University jointly organised the conference
