

#### Moriarty tells Take action against students of US help for army

The USA is committed to helping Bangladesh establish a more capable military answerable to civilian authorities, said US Ambassador to Bangladesh James Moriarty yesterday.

This will lead to a more stable and democratic Bangladesh, he claimed, adding that there will be increased firsthand cooperation to create a more secure and stable South Asia.

He said this while addressing, as the chief guest, the closing ceremony of a combined training at Jalalabad Cantonment in Sylhet in which a group of officers of Bangladesh Army and the US Armytookpart.

Fifty-seven commandoes of the First Para Commando Battalion of Bangladesh Army and nine members of Operational Detachment Alpha-1336 of the US Army took part in the five-week-long special training, the 18th such training with US forces.

In the training, touted Tiger Shark-2 and organised by the First Para Commando Battalion of Bangladesh Army, the US Special Forces team trained Bangladesh Army personnel on Combat Lifesaver, Combat Marksmanship, Close Quarter Battle and Heavy Rigger Training for Bangladesh's National Disaster Contingency operations.

The Bangladesh team imparted training on Unarmed Combat, Urban Tactics and Techniques in addition to Bangla language and culture training for the US team.

Moriarty said the training is one in a series of joint and combined exercise planned by the two militaries for this year and the next.

This year series of exercises will culminate in a combined Bangladesh-US exercise showcasing mutual capabilities to counter terrorism in the region.

He said the combined exercise Tiger Shark-2 is an example of rising contact between the friendly countries. The programme of instruction has not only developed the participants' combat skills, but has also furthered the mutual cooperation and understanding between the two militaries and the civilian governments.

Later the ambassador handed over certificates to Bangladeshi participants while the Area Commander gave away the certificates to the US participants.

The function was also addressed by Area Commander Major General Sheikh Md Monirul Islam, Commanding Officer of the Para Commando Battalion Lt Col Md Anwar Hossain, team leader of the US Special Force Capt Dustin E Delcoure and Major Mizanur Rahman, officer in charge of the joint training.

### Mainul refutes JS body allegations

Barrister Mainul Hosein, a former adviser to the caretaker government, yesterday dismissed as false the allegations brought against him and his family members by a subcommittee formed by the parliamentary standing committee on housing and public works ministry.

The sub-committee, which was formed to probe alleged irregularities, corruption and misuse of power by Mainul during the caretaker rule, submitted its report on Tuesday.

After receiving the report, the parliamentary committee asked Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha to file a murder case against Mainul for "neglect and ignoring safety measures" in demolishing Rangs Bhaban that led to death of 14 workers.

In a statement yesterday, Mainul termed the recommendations of the probe committee unwarranted and politically motivated.

He appealed to the chairman of the parliamentary committee to give him a copy of the probe report.

Mainul also wondered how could the probe body prepare its report without giving him any opportunity to defend

himself. He also claimed that the Rangs Bhaban was demolished under the supervision of an expert team of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology. The team's report said that the accident occurred due to faults in the ies and presidents and general construction of the building, he added.

After a gap of six years the government on May 7 published the list of 1,022 new non-government secondary and higher secondary educational institutions for giving the monthly pay order (MPO) facilities. But the prime minister

directed the education ministry to review the list in the face of vehement demand of some cabinet colleagues.

The institutions on MPO list get government subsidy as monthly pay orders to meet a portion of their teachers' salaries and benefits.

Teachers and employees of many newly MPO listed institutions expressed their concern saying the process could be delayed once again.

### You will not be eligible if you:

- (a) Are holding or have been nominated to receive another Australian Government scholarship;
- (b) Have held a foreign scholarship in the 24 months preceding the application;
- (c) Are a permanent resident or have applied for permanent residency in Australia;

(d) Are married or engaged to be married to a person who holds or who is eligible to hold Australian or New Zealand citizenship or permanent residence status. Applications are now open for commencement at an Australian university from January 2011.
