Madrassa students fare well

The Madrasa Education Board recorded 86.70 per cent pass rate in this year's Dakhil examinations, which is the highest among the country's ten education boards.

The pass rate of the board is 6.72 percentage points higher than the overall pass of 79.98.

Meanwhile the pass rate of the SSC (vocational) exams under the Technical Education Board stood at 82.72, a rise of 11.92 percentage points over the last year's.

Remarkable results show significant rise in GPA-5 achievers

The results of Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations-2010 broke all previous records with a pass rate of 78.19 percent and a sharp leap in the number of GPA-5 scorers.

As many as 62,134 students of eight education boards received the highest score of GPA-5 (grade point average) this year. Last year the pass rate was 67.41 with 45,934 students getting the highest grade point.

The number of schools with cent percent pass has also increased to 2,927 from last year's 2,726, while the number of schools with zero pass came down to 49 from 72.

The results of the SSC exams under eight education boards, the Technical Education Board and Madrasa Education Board were published yesterday. The education ministry published the results within two months of the exams for the second consecutive year.

One of the main reasons behind this record success was obtaining good marks both in English and Mathematics.

Under Dhaka Board, the average pass percentage in English first paper and second paper is 87.08. Last year it was 74.39 percent. The pass rate in Mathematics leapt to 88.03 percent this year from last year's 86.91.

None fails in 2,927 institutions

A total of 2,927 institutions under ten education boards secured 100 percent pass while 49 institutions have seen zero percent pass in this year's secondary school certificate and equivalent examinations.

Of the successful institutions, 150 are in Dhaka, 141 in Rajshahi, 85 in Comilla, 33 in Jessore, 31 in Chittagong, 32 in Barisal, 43 in Sylhet and 46 in Dinajpur.

Under Madrasa Board, 2,308 institutions achieved 100 percent success while the number of such institutions is 58 under the Technical Education Board (TEB).

Last year, the number of institutions with 100 percent success was 2,726 while it was

Better GPA score rate abroad

The examinees who sat the SSC and equivalent examinations from eight foreign centres this year were more successful in securing GPA 5 than others.

The percentage of GPA achievers from those foreign centres is 22.06 while it is only 6.81 in the case of the centres within the country.

As many as 261 students passed out of a total 281 from eight foreign centres. Of them 62 have secured GPA 5.

Of the 9,12, 577 students who took the examinations at the centres across the country 62,134 got GPA 5.

A total of 58 students passed out of 59 from Bangladesh International School in Jeddah. Of them 11
