Only 0.58 skilled health worker for 1000 people

The health sector of the country is suffering from an acute shortage of manpower, which has only 0.58 skilled health workers for every 1,000 people, speakers said at a seminar in the city yesterday.

According to the World Health Organization guidelines, there should have 2.5 skilled health workers for per 1,000 people, they said calling upon the private sector to come forward to make health workers to meet the growing demand.


RTM International and Katalyst jointly organised the dissemination seminar on 'private sector health'

Jewellery shop robbery: 5 held

Detectives yesterday arrested five people on charges of robbery at two jewellery shops at the Muktijuddha Super Market at Mirpur in the city.

A gang of burglars took away 782 tolas of gold from Dewan Jewellery on April 25 and another gang of robbers looted 267 tolas of gold from New Sananda Jewellers on March 3.

The detectives arrested Abbas Ali alias Kiron with over 20 tolas of stolen gold from his house at Kaliakoir of Gazipur for his involvement in the burglary at Dewan Jewellers.

Four others -- Yakub Mal, Kalam, Babul and Rafique who are involved in the robbery at New Sananda Jewellers -- were arrested from different parts in the capital and Gazipur. An auto-rickshaw they used for the robbery was also seized, said Assistant commissioner (AC) Mohammad Solaiman of DB said.

At the DB office in the city yesterday, Abbas admitted to reporters that they first broke

open the locks of Jyoti Cosmetics and Imitation Jewellers and made a hole into the common wall to enter Dewan Jewelley on the ground floor of the market.

Earlier, the police recovered 194 tolas of gold, stolen from Dewan Jewellry, at Jatrabari in the city on April 25 and arrested two alleged burglars -- Amir

and Alam -- on May 4. On March 9, five youths entered the New Sananda Jewellery posing as customers, pointed firearms at the lone employee present at the time and made off with over 250 tolas of gold ornaments.

AC Solaiman said, "Eight burglars committed the burglary at Dewan Jewelry using masonry tools to create a hole in the wall."

They arrested three burglars so far, he said and blamed the lax security system of the market for the robberies.

He said the security guard of the market is hearing impaired. So, he could not hear the burglars making a hole through the wall.

Attack on doctor protested

More than 200 doctors staged a sit-in at the Central Shaheed Minar in the city for two hours yesterday protesting the attack on Dr AKM Rafiquddin by unknown criminals.

Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA), Bangladesh Society of Medicine (BSM), Association of Physicians of Bangladesh (APB) and Dhaka Medical College Teachers' Association jointly organised the protest.

The criminals abducted Dr Rafiquddin from his Dhanmondi chamber on May 9, took him to Dhaka University area and beat him up before releasing him the same day. They also demanded Tk 10 lakh from him.

This incident is a threat to doctors' community, said Dr Abdur Rauf Sardar, vice-chairman of BMA.

The criminals filed a false case only to protect themselves, said Prof Dr Kazi Din Mohammad, principal of Dhaka Medical College. The demonstrators said that if no action is taken against the

criminals by May 22, they would form a human chain at Shahbagh on May 23 and the chambers of all specialist doctors in the city will remain closed on May 24.

Climate Change: EU to sign accord with 3 countries

The European Union is likely to sign an agreement with Bangladesh, Cambodia and the Maldives to assist the three countries to combat the adverse impact of the climate change.

The agreement is expected to be signed at the two-day regional conference of the Global Climate Change Alliance to be held in Dhaka on May 30-31 in collaboration with the European Union, officials said.

Nine countries of Asia - Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Bhutan, Cambodia, Laos, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal and Yemen - will participate in the conference.

In 2007, the European Commission formed the Global Climate Change Alliance to assist the countries most vulnerable to the climate change.






