## 'Formulate policy for private TV channels'

Television programme producers yesterday demanded a policy for private satellite channels having provisions of payment for programmes.

They placed the demand at a press conference at Dhaka Reporters Unity in the city.

The producers said they have dues of around Tk 5 crore to the recently closed Channel 1 and around Tk 25 crore to other private channels and demanded immediate payments of the bills.

They also threatened to launch a tough movement if the demands are not met.

Tarik Anam Khan, general secretary of the Television Programme Producers Association of Bangladesh (TPPAB), said the producers suffer the most due to absence of the policy.


"We face difficulties to realise our dues from the channels. They delay up to 120 days to pay the bills that they are bound to pay within 60 days after the supply of a programme according to deals between the two parties," he said.

Mamunur Rashid, president of the TPPAB, said this is a matter of the security of the artists in the industry. The government should formulate the policy to ensure their security, he added. They also demanded that

the government take steps to ensure the airing of Bangladeshi channels in neighbouring India. The government should

make the channels available in India, as Bangladeshi television programmes are popular to the people in that country.

# PM seeks 'comprehensive partnership' with S Korea

UNB, Seoul

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has sought 'Comprehensive Partnership' with South Korea to further expand economic cooperation between Dhaka and Seoul.

"Given the rapid growth and expan-sion of our trade, investment, and people-to-people contact, we would like to elevate our relations to the level of 'Comprehensive Partnership'," she said at a dinner hosted by Park Jin, chairman, Committee on Foreign Affairs, Trade and Unification, at National Assembly yesterday evening.

Hasina said both the countries have made painful sacrifices for freedom and democracy. "But, in one generation your great country has also achieved economic emancipation."

She said Bangladesh achieved independence after a bloody struggle in 1971 under the leadership of Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

The prime minister recounted that before the father of the nation could entrench democracy and emancipate the people from economic deprivation, he was assassinated with 18 members of their family on August 15, 1975.

"My younger sister, Rehana, and I were saved as we were abroad at the time. It was on 17 May, 1981 when I could come home with the popular support of the people."

Hasina said her life was a bitter struggle against military autocracy in pursuit of democracy. "I escaped 19 attempts on my life, including a grenade attack on 21st August in 2004 that left 22 dead and nearly 500 people injured." The prime minister said, "My struggle

continued, and for a time I again was exiled abroad. Again it was people's support that enabled me to return home."

Hasina said that to strengthen democracy, her government for the first time

established all 44 parliamentary standing committees, offering chairmanship of seven to other parties.

"I have reintroduced the prime minister's weekly question hour, so long shelved by the past government."

She said establishment of Korea-Bangladesh Parliamentarian's Friendship Association has also added to the strength of

Bangladesh's democracy. She thanked Kim Choong-Whan for his visit to Bangladesh early this year.

Hasina said she has requested Bangladesh's Speaker to establish a similar association in Bangladesh to interact with the Korean counterpart.

She sought Korean committee's support in deepening the friendship in the coming days. "Let us be partners in promoting democracy globally," she said.

Prime Minister's younger sister Sheikh Rehana and Commerce Minister Faruk Khan were, among others, present on the occasion.

# Bangladesh navy begins operation in Lebanon

Two Bangladesh Navy ships --BNS OSMAN and BNS MADHUMATI -- have reached Lebanon to take part in the UN Peacekeeping Mission under UNIFIL.

Already, BNS MADHUMATI and BNS OSMAN have started their operation in the Mediterranean Sea on May 15 and 17 respectively as part of the peacekeeping mission, said an ISPR release in the city yesterday.

BNS OSMAN and MADHUMATI left Chittagong port on April 12 and reached Beirut Port in Lebanon on May 7. Two ships were included in UN mission from that day. These ships have taken

voyage towards Lebanon. Members of both the ships performed "OMRAH HAJJ" during their stopover at Jeddah port. This is for the first time in South Asia, from where Bangladesh Navy Ships joined the UN Mission at UNIFIL.

At present, navy ships from Germany, Italy, Greece, Spain, Belgium and Turkey are included in the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL).

Meanwhile, Japanese and Indonesian navy have also expressed their interest to participate in that maritime task force.

It is a matter of great pride for Bangladesh Navy and the nation to participate with such developed and modern navy fleet in the said mission, the release said.

the eldest son of former prime minister Khaleda Zia, had turned the Hawa Bhaban a parallel powerhouse during the BNP-led four-party coalition government, earning bad name for the party. After BNP came to power in

2001, Ali Asgar Loby, former MP from Khulna, took the building at Bonani on rent from Ashek Ahmad for business purpose. In no time it was taken over by

Tarique, also the erstwhile senior joint secretary general of BNP and presently senior vice-chairman of the party, and turned into a 'parallel power centre'. Hawa Bhaban was sealed

after 1/11 when the army-backed caretaker government came to power and Tarique was taken into custody. Pressed upon the government

from London, Hawarun Ahmad has got back her house. An affluent person, she has arranged renovating the house to make it shining and attractive.

Her close relatives in Bianibazar said, "Kamaruddin Saheb wanted to purchase Hawa Bahavan and a deal with Ashek was almost reached. But now he backed out in the wake of criticism."
