'Party financing must be transparent, monitored'

Speakers at a roundtable yesterday said financing and spending activities of political parties should be transparent and strictly monitored.

The suggestion came at a roundtable on "Party Democracy and Financing of Political Parties in Germany: Relevance for Bangladesh" organised by the Bangladesh Enterprise Institute (BEI) at million. the BEI conference room in the city with

They said the issue of financing political parties needs to be addressed as it has a direct link to corruption in the political scenario of the country.

Alemann, a political science professor at the Heinrich Heine University in Germany, said political parties are necessary to uphold the democracy of a country, though they are blamed for corrup-

tion and inciting unrests.

The speakers added that political parties are necessary and restrictions should be imposed on their funding.

Jatiya Party (Ershad) Lawmaker Barrister Anisul Islam Mahmud said the political parties in Bangladesh spend around \$ 70 to \$ 80 million during the election campaigns where as in Germany the expenditure does not exceed \$60

The speakers suggested that the state BEI President Farooq Sobhan in the should monitor funding the political parties closely to curb corruption in the political scenario.

They termed that Bangladesh went through bitter experience on democracy after the death of Bangabandhu Sheikh In the keynote speech Dr Ulrich Von Mujibur Rahman. The common people cast tactical vote to elect their chosen candidate, they added.

The speakers also recommended the decentralisation of administration to strengthen local government infrastructure in the best practice of democracy.

BEI President Farooq Sobhan said Bangladesh has a lot of lessons to learn about party democracy from Germany as well as its neighbouring countries.

He also pointed out that there is a much lack of youth participation in the parliamentary affairs and said scopes are shrinking for the grassroots to actively join politics.

The former foreign secretary mentioned that a total of eight parliamentarians out of the 345 Members of the Parliament are aged below 40, and as much as 80 percent of them are business-

Metropolitan Magistrate Abdul Mazid granted them bail after their lawyers submitted a bail petition.

The other accused, who were granted bail, are Md Khokon, Manik, Abul Hossain, Deen Mohammad, Mofazzal Hossain, Bablu Shikder, Awal, Akkas, SM Shahjahan, Mamun Bepari, Abu Taher and Monir Hossain.

Shah Alam was arrested on May 10, while others were arrested later.

CASE AGAINST 4 NTV MEN

Submit probe report by September 2 Court asks Jatrabari OC

A Dhaka court yesterday asked officer-in-charge (OC) of Jatrabari Police Station, who is also an accused in a defamation case, to submit a report by September 2 on an investigation into the case filed against four ntv officials and 11 others on Sunday.

Metropolitan Magistrate AKM Emdadul Haque passed the order after scrutinising the documents submitted by the complainant of the case.

Alhaj Golam Ali Imam Bhuiyan, a former Sonali Bank official and a resident of Gobinapur, filed the case against the accused on charges of broadcasting a programme titled 'Crime Watch' on the ntv calling him a land grabber on May 11.

The accused are ntv news editor Khairul Anwar, Crime Watch producer and reporter Parvez Khan, cameramen Roni Raihan and Asaduzzaman, Jatrabari Police Station OC Maniruzzaman and ten others.

In his complaint, Golam Ali said that the private satellite channel ntv on May 11 and 12 broadcast a 'Crime Watch' programme where the ntv reporters took interviews from the landowners. In the interview, landowners called the

complainant a land grabber. The programme has tarnished his image in the society and hurt his name and fame, the complainant said.

In the petition, Ratan said that his client was not involved in the killing. He was implicated in the case as part of a conspiracy to harass him. So, he prayed for discharging his client from the murder charge.
