Nagarbari terminal faces Jamuna erosion threat

More than two hundred families have shifted their houses and over 500 acres of croplands have gone under water during the last three weeks as erosion by Jamuna River has taken a serious turn in Bera upazila under the district.

The river port terminal at Nagarbari, the largest fertiliser depot in the northern region, is also under threat as most of Nagarbari-Notakhola road has gone under water, port sources said.

"In Nagarbari, over 350 large warehouses contain-

ing fertiliser worth about Tk 150 core are facing the threat of erosion as the river is now only 300 feet away. Immediate step is needed to protect Nagarbari port," said Puran Varenga Union Parishad Chairman Md Rafikul Islam, also secretary of Nagarbari Port Terminal 120 families have shifted Traders Association.

At least 20 villages beside erosion. the Jamuna River in two unions of Bera upazila are facing the erosion threat, locals said.

Nagarbari, Raghunathpur, Protappur, Gonopotdia, Char Panchakola and Kazirhat are some of the badly affected villages.

Jamuna River has devoured at least 300 acres of crop fields in Char Panchakola village where their houses during the last Water Development three weeks, said Bera Upazila Parishad Chairman Md Azizul

Over 60 families at Kazirhat and Notakhola villages in the upazila also shifted their houses and

150 acres of cultivated lands have gone under water due to the erosion, the upazila chairman

In Gonopotdiar village, 10 houses were shifted recently due to the erosion, he said.

Contacted, Bera WDB Sub Divisional Engineer Md Anisur Rahman said, "A large project covering 1.5 kilometre area from Nagarbri to Raghunathpur has been taken to ensure protection of Nagarbari. The project will start after the rainy season. The emergency work will be conducted this year."

Faridpur medical college interns on strike

Interns at Faridpur Medical College and Hospital began a wildcat strike Sunday night after a patient assaulted a female intern, hospital source said.

The incident occurred at about 8:00 pm when Atikul Islam, 21, a patient of male medicine ward slapped onduty intern Beauty Chakma.

All the 75 interns stopped working immediately after the incident.

They yesterday placed 7point demand to Dr Guru Das Sikder, suprintendent of the hospital for punishment to the attacker and tightening of security at FMCH.

The interns also agitated in front of the office of the superintendent.

Dr Guru Das Sikder called an emergency meeting at his office at around 2:30 pm yesterday and assured the interns of taking steps after investigating the incident.

Among others, Dr ASM Jahangir Chowdhury Tito, vice principal of the medical college, Dr Khobirul Islam, lecturer of MATS, Dr Shafikur Rahman attended the meeting.

Additional Deputy Commissioner (revenue) Abdul Wahab Bhuiyan also visited the hospital and assured the interns of necessary action after the investigation but to no effect.

While visiting the hospital this correspondent found that patients at different wards, specially emergency and surgical, medicine and general, were suffering much

for the strike.

Kabir Hossain, a relative of a patient at the female medicine ward said, a number of serious patients have left the hospital in the morning for fear of getting no treatment.

Contacted, Dr Gurudas said, "We are trying to bring the situation under control".

Meanwhile, patient Atikul, who insulted Beauty Chakma, fled the hospital yesterday morning.

Banned guide books on sale defying HC directive

A section of bookstall owners have continued sale of banned note books and guide books in different upazilas of Sirajganj district as there is hardly any action against the authorities concerned are turning blind eyes.

A High Court directive, which prohibits printing, publication, supply and sale of note books and guide books, keeps provision for seven years of rigorous imprisonment or fine of Tk 25,000 or both for breach of the rule.

But a number of printing presses in Sirajganj town are involved in printing and supply of the notes and guides using the names of some renowned Dhaka-based publications or libraries like Jupiter, Panjery, Palki, Anupam, Internet, Lecture, Galaxy, Jhalak, Star

and Newton.

Some influential bookstall owners at Station Road and Bahirgola, locally called 'Boi Patti', are carrying out the trade of banned notes and guidebooks allegedly after managing some dishonest officials of district administration. Even, some textbooks, supplied by the government for free distribution, are sold at a few bookstalls.

Stall owners supply the notes and guidebooks to the school students allegedly through a section of teachers, headmasters and leaders of different teachers' organisations in exchange of good sums.

During this correspondent's visit to different schools in nine upazilas of the district, many students said they have already gotten all of the required notes or guidebooks. They said they have to read the

guides, as most of the teachers do not teach well in classes. "In most cases, teachers tell us to

memorise the lessons at home. So, we read the notes or guides to learn the answers to questions," said a student. "If a teacher discusses the lessons properly in the class, students would

not need notes or guides. But students still depend on notes or guidebooks, as many teachers fail to perform their duty in classes," said a teacher seeking anonymity. "A student can make good results

by reading the main textbook with attention. There is no need for any note or guidebook for this," said Latifa Khanom, acting headmaster of BL Government High School in Sirajganj

This correspondent also visited a number of bookstalls in Sirajganj town.

A few stall owners seeking anonymity said they sell the note books and guide books to the students secretly through some agents who are involved with different schools. For this purpose, they pay give some financial benefit to the teachers.

Several printing presses in the town, involved in printing and supply of the notes and guidebooks, use the names of a few renowned publications of Dhaka, they added. When contacted, Sirajganj Deputy

Commissioner Md Humayun Kabir said there will soon be drive against the illegal activities with the help of mobile courts.

Kibria Murder Case

Date for further investigation report deferred again

A Sylhet court yesterday again deferred the date for submission of the report on further investigation into former finance minister Kibria murder case.

Judge Md Mahbubul Islam of the Divisional Speedy Trial Tribunal deferred the date to May 24 as Special Public Prosecutor Kishore Kumar Kar sought time extension, saying that CID needs some more time to finish its investigation, court sources said.

Former finance minister SAMS Kibria, his nephew advocate Shah Manzurul Huda, local AL leaders Abdur Rahim, Abul Hossain and Siddique Ali were killed in a grenade attack at a public meeting at Baidderbazar under



Habiganj Sadar upazila on the night of January 27, 2005.

Munshi Atiqur Rahman, the then Senior ASP of CID, pressed charges against 10 people, including former Habiganj BNP leader Abdul Quaiyum, on March 20 the same year.

The tribunal ordered further investigation into the

case following a petition by the then Investigation officer Munshi Atique on March 7, 2007. Members of the Rapid

Action Battalion (Rab) on March 8 this year arrested Huji operative Mizanur Rahman Mithu in connection with Kibria murder case. Mithu gave confessional statement before the judicial magistrate, Habiganj, the following day.

The CID then took former state minister for home Luthfozzaman Babar on remand in connection with the case.

CID ASP Rafigul Islam, also the investigation officer of the case, told this correspondent they need some more time to submit the report on further investigation. He however said they will finish the task by the end of this month.

Tk 80cr allocated for KU projects

Government has allocated over Tk 80 crore to implement different development projects of Khulna University.

This is so far the highest allocation of fund for the university approved by the Ecnec, Vice Chancellor Prof Dr. Mohammad Saifuddin Shah told this correspondent last week.

The infrastructural development work under the projects include Tk 19crore 35lakh and 22,000 for completing ground and first floors of the third academic building and expansion of third and fourth floors of the same building, Tk 17crore for construction of a new residential hall for male students, Tk 17crore for a new residential hall for women students, Tk 7crore 83lakh and 15,000 for construction of central library of the university, Tk 6crore 3lakh and 80,000 for expansion work of Aparajita residential hall, Tk 2crore and 95lakh for building a guest house-cum-club, Tk 2crore 2lakh and 38,000 for expan- mentwork.
