Biography of Ouderland launched

A biography of Ouderland Bir Pratik, the only foreigner to receive a gallantry award for his contribution to the country's Liberation War, has been launched commemorating the Dutch-born Australian's ninth death anniversary.

Ouderland, born in 1917 in Amsterdam, was the chief executive officer of Bata Shoe Company when the war broke out in 1971. He took part in the war and was laterawarded Bir Pratik.

He remained in Bangladesh till 1978 and later settled in Australia. He died on May 18, 2001 at the age of 84.

The book launching ceremony was organised by Bureau of Human Rights Bangladesh (BHRB) at its conference room in the city yesterday.

Speaking as the chief guest, Civil Aviation and Tourism Secretary Shafique Alam Mehdi expressed admiration and respect for Ouderland for his role in the liberation war.

On a different note, he said the aviation ministry is free of any form of corruption and harassment, adding that anyone facing harassments at the ministry may post complaints, which would be looked into promptly.

Australian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Dr Justin Lee inaugurated the launching ceremony while Chief Executive Officer of RTV M Hamid and BHRB Secretary General Dr Md Shahjahan also spoke.

The book titled 'Bengali Biography on Ouderland Bir Pratik' is written by Mahbubur Rahman and will be available for purchase at a price of Tk 100.

'Drug addiction root cause of 60 percent crimes'

Drug addiction is the root cause of over 60 percent of total crime incidents in the country, and is causing most of the incurable fatal diseases like AIDS, speakers said at a seminar in the city yesterday.

They made the comment at the seminar on creating awareness about harmful effects and legal provisions regarding narcotics at Stamford University auditorium in Siddeswari.

Mujibur Rahman Patwary, deputy director of the Department of Narcotics Control (Dhaka Metro Sub-zone), said drug is the main enemy of the youth that count 40 percent of total population of the country.

Drugs are taken in different styles, but it is most alarming when those are taken in groups using a same syringe, he said adding incurable diseases are spreading fast through such addicts at different points of the city.

AKM Shahidul Hoque, commissioner of the Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP), said despite frantic efforts, law enforces could not contain the use of drugs due to lack of proper motivations by the families of the addicts.

The police officer said lessons on traffic rules and bad effects of drugs should be taught at schools.

Acknowledging that incidents of stalking are on the rise, Krishnopada Roy, deputy commissioner of the DMP (Ramna Zone), said there should have a social movement apart from the efforts of the law enforces against stalkers.

Prof MH Hannan Feroze, president of board of trustees of the university, presided over the seminar addressed by its Vicechancellor Prof M Mujibur Rahman, among others.
