

# All roads lead to Bernabeu

One of the great ironies of the 2 0 1 Champions League final between

Bayern Munich and Inter Milan at Real Madrid's Bernabeu stadium on Saturday is that the main protagonist for each side will be a Real reject.

Bayern's Arjen Robben and Inter's Wesley Sneijder were forced out of the Bernabeu last summer to make way for mega-money star signings Cristiano Ronaldo, Kaka and even Xabi Alonso and Karim Benzema.

Neither Robben nor Sneijder wanted to leave but Real's loss turned out to be Bayern and Inter's gain.

In fact the two Dutchmen have arguably been their new teams' best players this season with Robben scoring the crucial last goals in the Bavarians' 3-2 defeats at both Fiorentina and Manchester United to allow the Germans to squeeze through on away goals each time.

Sneijder's vision, passing and exact free-kicks have brought a new dimension to Inter's attacking play in the post-Zlatan Ibrahimovic era.

And the irony that two Real outcasts will once again be gracing the Bernabeu while their expensive replacements are already on holiday has not been lost on Bayern's Robben.

"We both wanted to stay in Madrid at the start of the season," he told the Bayern website.

"But the situation changed, and we both decided to go.

Inter's Jose Mourinho won the title with Porto in 2004 while Bayern's Louis van Gaal won it with Ajax in 1995.

But there is no love lost between the two as Van Gaal accused Inter of being negative and having help from the referees to reach the final, something which angered the Portuguese.

"In this Champions League both are huge characters. I don't remember another match like Inter-Barcelona at the San Siro," said Mourinho.

"No one else has played the football we played, no one else attacked the champions of Europe as much as we did.

"No one attacked as we did at Stamford Bridge (against Cheslea). We played two matches like no one else.

"Saying the things he said is like kicking sand in our faces."

And Mourinho pointed out that Bayern had had their fair share of favourable decisions, such as Miroslav Klose's clearly offside goal in the first leg against Fiorentina and the sending off of Manchester United fullback Rafael in the second leg against the Premier League team which United had been dominating until then.

"Italians have not forgotten the match against Fiorentina in the same way the English have not forgotten Rafael's red card, but that's not my problem," said Mourinho.

Argentina coach Maradona held his first training session with his World Cup squad on Thursday, and said he had high hopes for the June 11-July 11 tournament in South Africa.

"Our World Cup starts today because we start work with 17 players. We have high hopes," said Maradona, who led Argentina to World Cup glory in 1986.

Maradona was without five players for his first trip onto the paddock with his South Africa-bound squad.

Sergio Aguero played in Wednesday's King's Cup in Spain for his club Atletico Madrid, while Inter Milan duo Walter Samuel and Diego Milito, and Bayern Munich's Martin Demichelis were all in Madrid ahead of Saturday's Champions League final.

Clemente Rodriguez and Juan Sebastian Veron were to play for Estudiantes later Thursday.

Two-time champions Argentina were drawn alongside Nigeria, Euro 2004 champions Greece and 2002 semifinalists South Korea in Group B and begin their campaign against the African side on June 12.

## Tigers lose in three days

It could have ended on the second day but still, losing a four-day game on the third day would be embarrassing enough for Bangladesh after they conceded a moraleshattering 9-wicket defeat to the English Lions at the County Ground in Derby yesterday.

The second string English side completed the formalities of chasing down a simple 86run target in only 16.4 overs of their second innings.

Jahurul Islam, one of the few batsmen to have shown some fight with the bat, remained unbeaten on 58 as the final wicket, that of Rubel Hossain, fell nearly an hour after play started on the third day to part-time seamer Ravi Bopara. The number eleven's 43-ball stay at the crease must have been heartening for the team management but the pleasure would be badly misplaced as the main batsmen struggled to stay for more than 57 overs in the last match before the first Test that begins

### Nayan the difference

A last gasp strike from Nayan helped Wanderers Club defeat Mohakhali XI 3-2 in the Bashundhara Senior Division Football League at the Birshreshtha Shaheed Mostafa Kamal Stadium yesterday.

If you believe Van Hanegem, Holland lost the match there and then. Half the team wanted to push on and look for a second goal, the rest to play keep-ball and humiliate the Germans.

More to the point perhaps, Vogts' marking of Cruyff began to bite. Virtually all of Holland's fifteen goals in the tournament started or finished with their captain, who protested about Vogts' treatment at half-time and was booked. By then Taylor had made a bigger den in Holland's chances.

As against Poland, Holzenbein ran into the penalty area from the left and went over an outstretched foot, this time Jansen's. There was something oddly inevitable about it, as if Taylor was always likely to give a second penalty the other way.

But this one was far more controversial. On the screen, Holzenbein dives after the event -- but Jansen does seem to catch him, so a penalty wasn't unjustified.

After Hoeness' miss against Poland, Breitner took the kick and beat a stationary Jongbloed.

The turning point, if there was one, came when Cruyff broke away, drew Beckenbauer, and gave the ball to Rep on his left. Maier saved the rather unimaginative shot. Almost on half-time, Bonhof's running made its biggest impact, taking him past Haan to the right-hand goal line. When he pulled the ball back, Muller stopped it with an exaggerated action that looked like a miskick, then shot low across Jongbloed (immobile again) as Krol made a desperate attempt to block. It was Muller's 68th goal in 62 matches for West Germany, an astounding average in such a defensive era. Like Schiavio in 1934, he retired from international football after scoring the winner in the final for the host country.

Maier, vastly improved since 1970, made another of his marvellous saves from Neeskens' close-range volley, and Holland pressed throughout the second half -- but Beckenbauer and Overath kept the play away from them and Cruyff couldn't escape Vogts, who had his most famous match. General disappointment at Holland's defeat, especially as West Germany had no Netzer to compensate -- but the hosts had shown there was more than one way to win a football match, and it was only right that Beckenbauer, Overath, Grabowski and Muller should have World Cup winners' medals, hard though it was on Krol, Neeskens, Van Hanegem and the inimitable Cruyff, who was cut down on the one day Holland, and the football world, wanted to see him blossom.

Two-time champions Abahani are just one point away from a hattrick of Bangladesh League titles when the Sky Blues man-

aged a 2-1 win over Sheikh Russel KC in their home match at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday. Shahedul Alam put Abahani ahead in

the first half only to have the lead canceled out by Mohammad Rony five minutes from time and prolific striker Enamul Haque struck the decisive goal in the dying moments to put Abahani on the verge of yet another glory.

With ten straight victories in the second leg of the country's most prestigious football competition, an unbeaten Abahani lifted their points tally to 64 from 22 matches and need only a single point from their two remaining matches against Farashganj and rivals Mohammedan Sporting Club to take an unassailable lead in the 13-team table as their nearest rivals Mohammedan have 58 points with two matches in hand.

Sheikh Russel, who have ensured a third-place finish, are on 47 points from 22 outings.

There was no sign of that performance Abahani put in the recently concluded AFC President's Cup Qualifiers where they remained empty-handed and

Abahani coach Amalesh Sen said that it was because of the absence of injured playmaker Pranotosh Kumar and defender Mohammad Sujan. Besides, defenders Atiqur Rahman Mishu and Rajani Kanta Barman played the game with injuries and that's why his charges could not play their natural game, claimed Amalesh.

Sheikh Russel started the game with great pace to keep their mighty opponents at bay and they should have taken a lead in the initial moments, but it was not understandable when Moroccan midfielder Salah Maslouh, with only Abahani goalkeeper Biplob Bhattacharjee to beat, cut the ball back to his compatriot Samir Omari instead of taking a shot on the target on the edge of the right-hand corner of the eight-yard box and the chance went begging.

Abahani, who remained unbeaten for 33 matches including 11 in the previous league, also came close to opening their account when Ghanaian striker Awudu Ibrahim flicked a Mehdi Hasan Ujjal cross only to be blocked by a defender inside the danger zone after 15 minutes.

Sheikh Russel midfielder Maruf Ahmed tried his luck from distance when he let loose a dipping shot that was fisted by Biplob on the half-hour mark.

Shahedul finally broke the deadlock when the promising midfielder drove leftback Ibnul Siraji's cut-back home past

Sheikh Russel goalkeeper Mamun Khan in the 33rd minute.

After resumption, Enamul set by Ibrahim struck straight to goalkeeper Mamun Khan to disappoint Abahani in the 64th minute before Sheikh Russel striker Rony capitalising on a right-side cross from Rajon Mia, leveled the margin with a placing shot in the 85th minute. Interesting no players celebrated after the equaliser.

With two minutes to go, Enamul, after failing to beat goalkeeper Mamun in a one-on-one situation, struck the decisive goal seemingly facing no challenge from the opponent defenders and raised his goal tally to 19, one more than rivals Mohammedan's striker Zahid Hasan Emily. "It might seem to you (that it was too

easy)," was the reply of Abahani coach Amalesh, who was asked about the seemingly trouble-free decider scored by Enamul. Amalesh however blamed defender Nazrul Islam and Rajani for conceding the equaliser. Sheikh Russel coach Mahmudul Haq

Liton said, "We always play a fighting game and look at the past, we also went down against Mohammedan despite putting up a fighting show." "I will ask the defenders at the team

briefing how they conceded the second goal," said a smiling Sheikh Russel coach on way to the dressing room.
