Robbers looted valuables worth Tk 10 lakh from four houses injuring two house owners at Govindapur village of Sreepur upazila in Magura on Friday, reports our correspondent.

Police and locals said a gang of robbers numbering 8/10 stormed into the houses of Palash Biswas, Pratima Biswas, Haripada Biswas and Nirapada Biswas one after another exploding bombs, leaving house owners Nirapoda and Palash injured

Robbers loot six Stolen diesel seized houses, 5 caught in Bhola, 8 arrested

Members of the Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) launched a special drive at Pangasha launch ghat in Bhola early yesterday and seized about one lakh litres of stolen diesel and 12 oil tankers and arrested eight members of an oil pilferage gang.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of Rab-8 launched the drive in Beduria area at around 4:30am and arrested the gang members while they were loading an oil tanker.

During interrogation, the criminals told Rab members that they loaded one lakh litres of stolen diesel in a tanker owned by Kabir alias 'Tel' Kabir of Bhola onto a Khulna-bound ship from Chittagong on a river in Bhola.

They gave Tk 19 lakh bribe to the officers and employees of the ship on the night of May 21 and brought the oil to Pangasha launch ghat.
