

Rab team confined

Satkhira villagers allege bid to implicate businessman, set them free after 5 hours upon apology

Agitating villagers confined a team of Rapid Action Battalion to a house for over five hours early yesterday for allegedly trying to implicate a local businessman in an illegal arms possession charge.

The villagers of Natuardanga village in Sadar upazila confined the Rab-6 personnel as the team led by Maj Kamruzzaman went to search the house of Shafiqul Islam, owner of a shrimp enclosure, around 12:30am.

Shafiq, also organising secretary of Shibpur union unit Awami League, claims when the Rab men attempted to raid his house, he urged them to do it in presence of the villagers.

He alleges the Rab members cut the balcony grills to enter the house and laid three shutter guns inside. On information, hundreds of villagers surrounded the house

and confined the Rab men to it around 2:30am. A team of Satkhira Sadar police led by Officer-in-Charge

Hashem Khan arrived on the scene around 5:30am but could not ease the situation. Another Rab team of 12 members also reached the spot to help the police.

A clash between football fans of Brazil and Argentina at two villages in Bera upazila of Pabna left 30 people, including five policemen, injured yesterday morning.

Police and locals said the clash between the residents of Sheikhpara and Dakshinpara started around 10:00am after a brawl between the fans. The FIFA World Cup is due to begin on June 11.

Both the groups used sharp weapons, sticks and brickbats during the clash. Policemen of Bera Police Station rushed to the spot and tried to control the situation.

They fired six shots into the air to disperse the groups, Officer-in-Charge Md Jillur Rahman said.

Lack of coordination affects dist AL activities

ALCWC meeting told; Hasina urges Khaleda to withdraw hartal

Lack of coordination among ruling Awami League lawmakers, leaders and workers in many districts across the country is affecting party activities, organising secretaries of the party said in their reports submitted to AL President and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina last night.

At a meeting of the AL Central Working Committee at the Gono Bhaban with Hasina in the chair, they also said organisational strength of the party in those districts is decreasing, according to meeting sources.

The meeting relieved Noakhali district unit AL President Mohammad Hanif from his position on charge of involvement in anti-organisational activities. The decision is based on recommendations by the district unit earlier.

A report from Patuakhali district AL was placed at the meeting seeking organisational action against party lawmaker from

Patuakhali-3 Golam Mawla Roni for anti-party activities. Hasina directed the organising secretaries to deal with the

Climate change victims ask developed world

People affected by natural disasters in coastal and char areas urged the developed world to cut carbon emissions and give financial compensations at a discussion on climate impact in the capital vesterday.

They also appealed to the government for immediate repair of the coastal embankments damaged by cyclone Aila in Khulna and Satkhira regions in May last year. The Climate Poverty Hearing was jointly organised by Oxfam GB Bangladesh and Campaign for Sustainable Rural Livelihood (CSRL) at the National Press Club.

Sarbanu Khatun from Satkhira, Jahanara Begum from Sunamgonj and Hamida Begum from Gaibandha described the damage done to them by natural disasters, and how they were deprived of food, shelter, health and education as a consequence of the climate change. Hamida said her family used to live by growing onion, garlic,

peanuts, oil seeds, and maize on char land. But the intrusion of saline water has destroyed the crops for the last couple of years. "I have three school-going children but they cannot attend

"We do not ask for loans, nor charity or relief from the developed world. We want them to cut carbon emissions and we want to survive on our own resources," said Hamida.

school, as I am unable to feed them," she said.

Sarbanu's husband had given his agricultural land to shrimp farmers as he failed to grow traditional crops due to saline water. He then started to collect honey from the Sundarbans for a living, but one day a tiger killed him, Sarbanu said.

She added that she with her four children has been homeless since Aila hit the area.
