Saline water eats their lives away

PORIMOL PALMA, back from Gabura, Satkhira

Efforts to extract freshwater cannot soothe Safat Gazi, a 72-year-old resident of Kholpetua village in the extreme saline water-prone Gabura union in Shyamnagar.

Having suffered by salinity for long, he now anxiously waits for freshwater from the monsoon rain.

"We are now seeking blessings of

Allah...rainwater... as we are in a severe drinking water crisis I have never experienced in my 72-year lifetime," said Safat, shooting his looks everywhere as if he was looking for a source of drinking water.

As he was speaking, he was desperately scratching all over his body. He said he cannot remain calm for the itches due to saline water.

Their village, named after the adjacent Kholpetua river, is home to some 3,500 people. Before the cyclone Aila hit

the coast on May 25 last year, they used to get freshwater from four big ponds. But after the storm, the ponds have become only a good source of saline water.

Salinity has reached so deep underground that neither shallow nor deep tube-wells can extract drinking water anymore. Local NGO Progoti with the assistance of Oxfam fetches water from a deep tube-well in Jaliakhali, eight kilometres off the village.

2 POWER PLANTS, LNG TERMINAL

Govt starts land acquisition

SHARIER KHAN

The government has started acquiring land in Khulna, Chittagong and Moheshkhali to build two very large coal-fired power plants and a terminal for importing liquefied natural gas (LNG). About 1,200 acres of land near the Chittagong Urea Fertiliser

Ltd factory and 1,800 acres opposite to the Mongla Port will be acquired for the two power plants, a top Power Development Board official said. In one of the islands near Moheshkhali, the authorities are

acquiring 5,000 to 6,000 acres of land to build the LNG terminal and space for a future large coal power plant. That site was chosen as the draft there allows larger LNG carriers and coal carrying ships to dock. Other coastal areas lack the necessary draft.

Due to the shallowness of water in Khulna, the government is now planning to reduce the power generation capacity of the plant there to 600 MW from 1,320MW. The capacity of the
