3 more rental power deals get go-ahead

Expected to generate 240MW by Feb

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The cabinet committee on purchase yesterday approved three contracts with local companies for setting up rental power plants of total 240-megawatt capacity.

The plants are expected to be in operation in February next year, sources said after a purchase committee meeting yesterday.

The high cost of power generation from these three plants would lead to a monthly subsidy of Tk 50 crore by the government.

The government has agreed to provide

The unsolicited deals were made upon negotiations between the Power Development Board and PDV Power & Sirus, IFDC-Valcan Energy, and Power Pac Holdings.

The purchase committee at the meeting chaired by Finance Minister AMA Muhith sent back three other rental power contracts saying the authorities should negotiate further with the companies concerned to reduce their proposed

Power, Khulna Power and IEL Consortium. Of them, IEL Consortium

had not built a power plant before while the other two are more experienced than the ones awarded with power contracts.

"We will re-negotiate with these companies," said Cabinet Secretary MA Aziz while briefing journalists after the meeting, "upon successful negotiations, we will consider approving these projects".

The approved power projects are not cheaper than the ones sent back to the ministry. Summit and Khulna power proposed tariff that is higher by few poisas per unit than that of approved ones These three companies are Summit while the proposed tariff of IEL Consortium was the lowest.

SC lawyer faces music for forgery

The High Court for the first time has directed the Bangladesh Bar Council to cancel enrolment of Supreme Court lawyer MA Hamid for committing forgery in filing a writ petition with the court.

The court asked the Bar Council and the Supreme Court Bar Association to prevent Hamid from doing legal practice in any court.

The HC bench of justices AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik and Md Delwar Hossain gave the orders after reviewing previous records of MA Hamid, who alleg $edly \, submitted \, forged \, documents \, to \, another \, HC \, bench.$

The court said MA Hamid submitted a fake certificate to another HC bench of Justice AFM Abdur Rahman for having a court order in his favour. But the bench then did not take any action against him considering his old age.

Hamid filed a writ petition with this HC bench on May 12 on behalf of two persons challenging the formation of a school's governing body in Chapainawabganj despite the fact that the same writ petition had been rejected earlier by another HC bench.

Bangladesh, Indonesia and Iran are the countries that are the most vulnerable to natural disasters, according to a study released yesterday.

Asia's twin giants, China and India, join them in the 15 countries that, out of 229, are rated as "extreme" risk.

They enrolled themselves in the training programme using fake identity as headmaster and gave false names of their schools, said the

institute officials.

The six-day training programme on "teaching quality improvement" began on May 22, was scheduled to end today.


A section of unscrupulous people wanted to misappropriate the project money of about Tk 4.20 lakh that was allocated for distribution among the participants, they said.
