Patuakhali Jamaat office ransacked, ameer beaten up

Patuakhali office of Jamaat-e-Islami was ransacked and district unit ameer beaten up yesterday.

In Bogra, police on Sunday arrested a Jamaat leader in connection with a case filed against 300 unnamed Jamaat-Shibir activists for holding a rally on Friday defying Section 144 and manhandling a UNO at Fultala Senior Fazil Madrasah ground in Shahjahanpur upazila, reports UNB.

The arrestee was principal of the madrasah Maulana Ramjan Ali Akand. He was picked up from his office. Police were conducting night-time raids in the houses of Jamaat-Shibir men to arrest them for their alleged involvement in Friday's incident.

Eight local Jamaat leaders and two sons of ex-Jamaat Ameer of Bogra and former MP late Maulana Abdur Rahman Fakir were named in the case along with 300 unnamed Jamaat-Shibir activists.

In the case police said Jamaat and Shibir men held rally at the madrasah ground defying the ban imposed by the administration and intentionally assaulting the government official while performing his official duty on the day.

Sec 144 at Godagari

The upazila administration of Godagari yesterday imposed Section 144 around Dayingpara intersection as Jamaat-e-Islami and its rival Jubo League called a meeting at the same venue. Official sources said, the ban order bars holding of any meeting or gathering between 3:30pm to 10:00pm. Zakirul Islam, officer-in-charge of Godagari police station said both groups called the meeting almost at same time on Sunday night. Upazila Jubo League general secretary Shamim Reza Raju said, they informed police on Sunday morning about their meeting aimed at demanding trial against war criminals. Contacted, Jamaat's Godagari municipal unit general secretary Matiuur Rahman said they informed police about their meeting on Sunday evening.

Two commit 'suicide'

UNB, Bogra

Two housewives allegedly committed suicide in Dhunat upazila here in last two days. Sources said Sonavan Bibi, 65, wife of Akimuddin Akhand of Pakurihata village in the upazila took her life by hanging from the ceiling of her house on Sunday morning. The reason behind the suicide could not be known immediately. In another incident, Shohagi Begum, 22, wife of Anwarul Islam, of Mathpara village in the same upazila allegedly committed suicide by hanging from the ceiling of her bed room following a quarrel with her mother-in-law on Saturday evening. The bodies were sent to Sadar hospital morgue for autopsy.

Bus supervisor killed

Police recovered the body of a bus counter supervisor of Bhaberchar bus stand in Gazaria upazila on Dhaka-Chittagong highway Sunday. The deceased was identified as Habib, 28, supervisor of Gazaria Paribahan, hailed from Meghna upazila of Comilla district. Police said Habib went missing since Saturday night. Later, his co-worker Alamgir found his body at the counter Sunday morning and informed the police. On information, police rushed to the spot and recovered the body. The body was sent to Sadar hospital morgue for autopsy.

Police said they recovered the body of Biplob Borai, 15, son of Rabindranath Borai of Ramchandrapur village in Kaliganj upazila from a field in nearby Dulamundia village in the morning. The deceased was identified as Biplob Borai, 15, son of Rabindranath Borai of village Ramchandrapur in Kotchandpur upazila. Biplob was working at his father's tea stall at Baluhar bus stand in Kotchandpur upazila town. He was also running a rent-a-motorbike business. Police suspected that criminals strangled him following a previous enmity. The body was sent to Sadar hospital morgue for autopsy. Besides, another unidentified body of a young man was recovered by police in the morning from a road at village Nrisinghapur in Sadar upazila. The body was also sent to the same hospital morgue for postmortem.

Identifying problem and finding the way out

500 join conference on participatory research

Over 500 people from Rajshahi and neighbouring districts joined a conference at Dr Kaiser Memorial auditorium of Rajshahi Medical College yesterday, sharing their success stories in ensuring human rights through self-research.

They are gono gabeshak -- they identify the problems in respective villages and find out ways to resolve it through participatory action research.

They conduct anti-narcotics drives, sanitation programme and work to ensure justice for all.

The researchers, mostly from different minority groups, indigenous people and ultra-poor families, are playing entrepreneurship role in different development works and protection of human rights at their villages.

At yesterday's conference organised under Setu Bandhan project of NGO Broti, the researchers shared their experience in raising voice against dowry, child marriage and oppression on women at their villages.

Broti arranged training for the public researchers under its Setu Bandhan project assisted by Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF).

Eminent litterateur Prof Hasan Azizul Haque attended the conference as chief guest while MJF Executive Director Shaheen Anam, Language Movement veteran Abul Hossain, Jatiya Adibashi Parishad General Secretary Rabindranath Soren, Broti Executive Member Dr Mahmuda Islam were present as special guests.

Sharmin Murshid, chief executive of Shetu Bandhan project, presided over the function.

Earlier Rajshahi Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton inaugurated the programme and took part in a colourful rally amid songs and dances

presented by indigenous men, women and children.

Prof Hasan Azizul Haque called upon all to devote to building a nation free from disparity and injustice, starting the practice at family levels.

"The curse of social degradation would be gone if people learn to honour rights of each other. Bangladesh was liberated with a goal towards economic and social freedom and building a society free from disparity," Shaheen Anam said.

"No development can sustain without state-protection for the indigenous people. Miseries of the indigenous people are endless as they fall victim to the land grabbers and influential quarters," said Rabindranath Soren.

Classes held at Sust despite strike call

Classes were held as usual at Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) yesterday despite the JCD's call for an indefinite strike on the campus.

Students and Sust Registrar Ishfaqul Hussain told this correspondent in the afternoon that classes were held as usual. Movement of Sust buses and other vehicles was also normal.

JCD called the strike after some of its activists were injured in an attack by the activists of ruling party backed BCL Sunday evening near the Sust central mosque. Sust BCL convener Mostafizur Rahman Raju led faction made the attack, the JCD alleged.

Campus sources informed that a group of

BCL men went to the central mosque where the JCD men were attending a *milad* and *doa mehfil* marking the 39th death anniversary of late President Ziaur Rahman on Sunday afternoon.

However, the BCL men left the area after some teachers told them to leave the spot.

After sometime when the JCD men came out of the mosque, the BCL men, armed with sticks, iron rods and sharp weapons, attacked them all of a sudden at about 6:30 pm. Seven out of 10 who sustained injuries were taken to the MAG Osmani Medical College and Hospital.

However, BCL denied the allegations and claimed that they went to the mosque area to resist the outsiders brought there by the JCD men.
