Blatter's call for ending racism

FIFA president Sepp Blatter called for an end to racism and discrimination in football on the eve of the first World Cup finals to be held in Africa at FIFA's 60th annual Congress on Thursday.

Blatter, 74, who is due to stand for a fourth term of office next year, did not deliver a passionate, electioneeringstyle address to delegates from 207 of FIFA's 208 member countries.

Instead he concentrated on the aim of world football's governing body to eradicate society's vices that blight the game, especially racism and discrimination.

"Football is a mirror of our society and is touched by its vices. Violence, cheating, doping, betting, discrimination and racism, these are all in our game.

"We have started to eliminate them, one is practically eliminated -- this is doping.

"But here in this World Cup in South Africa, and specifically through this Congress, we declare we are against discrimination."

The Commonwealth Games will get underway in New Delhi from the first week of October.

Shakib lays blame on middle-order

Shakib Al Hasan blamed the Tigers' inexperience and constant chopping and changing for their recent uninspiring performances in the longer-version of the game.

The Bangladesh skipper was speaking to the reporters upon their arrival at the Shahjalal International Airport from London after yet another 2-0 loss in a two-Test series, this time in England. The Tigers' only achievement was to push the game to tea on the fifth day in the first Test at Lord's but the batting debacle in Manchester exposed their frailty.

"We have been a young side for the last ten years. The players have not been given a chance to settle down," said Shakib.

"You should take a look at Zimbabwe, how they are getting results having persisted with one set of players for the past 4-5 years," added the Magura-born captain of the national team.

Keeping improvement in the forefront of his views on the tour, Shakib took the blame upon himself but also found the form of the bowlers wanting. "Everyone knows that we did well in the first Test but not the second game. Not just avoid the follow-on, we were in a position to score big in the first innings but we failed. The bowling wasn't too good in the series either," he said.

But one man who can lay claim to be the lone shining light in the series would be Tamim

Iqbal. The left-handed opener struck back-toback centuries and a fifty, runs that helped hush some of the critics. "From my point of view it was a good series. Two centuries and a half-century in English conditions is not a simple task but as far as the team is concerned, it wasn't such a good series," said Tamim who praised Imrul Kayes and Junaed Siddiqui but pointed out the lack of runs from the middle-order.

"It is quite sad that the middle and lower order didn't perform and this became our problem (in England), making our performance in the two Tests inconsistent," added Tamim, who was Bangladesh's man-of-theseries with 268 runs.

"Ever since bhaiya (Nafees Iqbal) told me that there is an honours board in Lord's where the centurion's name is etched forever, I wanted to score there," said Tamim who confirmed that his gesture after reaching his hundred was towards Pete the dressing-room attendant.

Shakib, who thought the Tigers' World Twenty20 show was encouraging, seemed optimistic about their prospects in the upcoming Asia Cup. The skipper thinks that a win against either India, Pakistan or Sri Lanka is not impossible.

The national team players will only get a day's break at home as they are scheduled to fly for Colombo tomorrow to take part in the Asia Cup which will kick off from June 15 in Dambulla.

Lara, Ganguly to star for MCC

Sourav Ganguly will captain Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) in a side featuring cricket great Brian Lara when they face the touring Pakistanis in a Twenty20 fixture at Lord's on June 27.

The match will be the first time that MCC, which owns Lord's, has played a Twenty20 fixture.

It will also be the first time Pakistan captain Shahid Afridi has played at Lord's since his man-of-the-match winning display in last year's World Twenty20 final win against Sri Lanka.

Lara, the former West Indies captain and one of cricket's greatest batsmen, will be playing for MCC for the first time.

Former India captain Ganguly, also a lefthanded batsman, is currently skippering the Kolkata Knight Riders in the Indian Premier League.

Among those also confirmed to play for MCC are Sri Lanka left-arm pace bowler Chaminda Vaas and Australian one-day spe-

cialist Ian Harvey. "MCC is delighted to welcome to Lord's a Pakistani side who have a proven track record in Twenty20 cricket," said John Stephenson, MCC's head of cricket and himself a former England batsman, in a statement.

'Shahid Afridi's men will face an exciting MCC team comprising world class performers and up-and-coming talent.

"Brian Lara is one of the finest batsmen to have ever played the game and Sourav Ganguly is a world-leading Twenty20 cricketer," added Stephenson, who helped select MCC's team.

"The match will provide spectators with a fantastic opportunity to see wonderful cricket

and great cricketers."

The Twenty20 match forms part of the sponsorship agreement between MCC and the Pakistan Cricket Board which will see Pakistan play Australia in the MCC Spirit of Cricket Test and Twenty20 Series in England throughout July, with both Twenty20 matches at Birmingham's Edgbaston ground.

The two Tests between Pakistan and Australia, at Lord's and Headingley will be the first 'neutral' Tests to be played in England in nearly a century since the 1912 triangular tournament featuring England, Australia and South Africa.

Pakistan will also play four Tests and five one-day internationals against England starting in July.

England face Australia in five one-day internationals, with the first at Hampshire's Rose Bowl ground on June 22.

No feed from South to North

South Korea will not provide North Korea with TV coverage of the World Cup, as tensions over the sinking of one of Seoul's warships continue to simmer, a television station confirmed Thursday.

The impoverished communist state, which has qualified for the event for first time in 44 years, wanted the South to provide free footage as it did for the 2006 tournament in Germany.

Four years ago, the then-liberal government in Seoul -- which practised a "sunshine" engagement policy with Pyongyang -- spent 150 million won (132,600 dollars) subsidising the broadcasts.

The current conservative government has not followed suit amid worsening relations.

SBS TV, which bought exclusive broadcasting rights for the whole Korean peninsula from FIFA, had demanded a fee from the North, a spokesman for the station said. "Talks have made little progress, especially after the sinking.

Now we cannot bring the talks to a conclusion in time for the Cup," he told AFP. South Korea concluded last month that a North Korean submarine fired a heavy torpedo that sank a 1,200-tonne warship with the loss of 46 lives, one of the deadliest incidents since the 1950-53 Korean War.

Who will shine brighter?

They are widely acknowledged as the best players in the world. But who will shine brighter at this year's World Cup finals -- Argentina's footballer-of-the-year Lionel Messi or previous accolade

The two starlets ply their trade on opposite

sides of the Spanish footballing divide and for the most part it has been the Argentine who has come out on top. First, he nodded in the clincher in the 2009

Champions League final to see off his rival's then club Manchester United. Then, Messi landed another Spanish league

crown with 34 league goals enough to see him crowned champion and top marksman as Ronaldo had to settle for runner-up with Real Madrid after his 80 million euro move from Old Trafford.

It was the same story as Messi carried off the FIFA world footballer of the year award.

The two stars can only meet if both sides reach the final -- but the form of both players will be instrumental in how their respective nations do.

A curious facet of both countries' qualifying was that both players struggled to shine in the way they do for their clubs.

Argentina limped through in the fourth and final regional qualifying spot while Ronaldo did not even score throughout a campaign which only saw Portugal's tickets secured via a playoff success over Bosnia.

Now the stakes are high for Messi's gauchos and Ronaldo's Portuguese as they try to click in the national shirt.

The Argentine has a point to prove after coach Diego Maradona publicly anointed

Messi as his successor, then saw the man they nickname "the flea" fail to create much buzz during a qualifying campaign which reached its nadir with a 6-1 hiding away to Bolivia.

But Messi is focused and has fixed his eyes on the prize -- which would add to the unprecedented six trophies he won in 2009 with Barca.

"The year I had (in 2009) I can only top off by winning the World Cup and I hope I can raise my game in the national team," the player who is modest to a fault recently said.

Certainly the man who can cause defenders to have sleepless nights has the talent to win matches almost on his own -- if the Barcelona version shows up.

"I hope to produce the same form as for Barcelona," Messi noted before arriving in South Africa while explaining that it was difficult to put his finger on the difference between the club game and the international version.

I will give the answer to that one out on the pitch," he promised.

Likewise Ronaldo, who won a full set of domestic honours with United, must hope that donning a red shirt once more -- this time of his country -- will help him to step up a gear and revive the national side.

His role, both for providing goals but also supplying them, is now enhanced by the absence through injury of former clubmate Nani.

The 25-year-old, like Messi, is totally focused on the prize.

"When I hang up my boots I want to be remembered as having been an exemple and a fantastic player. I want to go down in history." Having come off second best in his contests

to date with Messi, Ronaldo will gain scant consolation from the knowledge that he has just been unveiled in wax form at Madame Tussauds museum in London -- joining Pele, David Beckham and Steven Gerrard, while Messi has yet to feature at the top attraction.
