

# Little Maisha wins first prize

Draw of The Daily Star-Rangs Toshiba World Cup Quiz Round 2

The world's greatest sporting extravaganza, the football World Cup, started yesterday at the Soccer City in Johannesburg which will grip us like all the people of the world for the next thirty days with all its glory, charm, excitement, sorrows and happiness.

But even before a ball was kicked, the tournament has occasioned for immense joy for little Maisha Siddiqua Soha and her family, courtesy of The Daily Star-Rangs Toshiba World Cup Quiz 2010. The five-year-old nursery student from the Little Jewels' School of Dhaka became the proud winner of the first prize -- an 8 CFT Toshiba refrigerator -- in the second round draw held at the historic Muslim Institute Auditorium here in Chittagong yesterday.

Soha and her family were having a picnic at their house on occasion of the start of the World Cup and the news of winning the prize magnified their happiness.

The second prize (a 24" Toshin LCD TV) went to Ms Shelly, a housewife from Pahartali in Chittagong.

This was the second draw out of six rounds for the World Cup quiz, the first one being held in Barisal on June 2. This time, unlike on that occasion, two Chittagonians won prizes while the other three were citizens of Dhaka.

The event was held at the auditorium of the Muslim institute, ornated with colourful banners and festoons for the occasion, in the afternoon in presence of hundreds of football fans and notable personalities of the city.

Inside the auditorium, World Cup fever was firmly felt as the crowd divided into two groups -- Argentina and Brazil -- when the Editor of The Daily Star Mahfuz Anam asked the audience which teams they would support during the tournament.

Mahfuz Anam urged everyone to support motherland Bangladesh as they are supporting Brazil and Argentina in a bid to take the nation forward.

"We will have to have a dream, we will have to have determination to build up ourselves for the biggest of challenges. When we started The Daily Star, there were many skeptics about our success, but we had the deter-

## Tigers off to Colombo today

Bangladesh cricket team will be off to Colombo today to play in the Asia Cup that begins on June 15.

The only cause for concern for the Tigers, who depart tonight at 9.30pm, will be the fitness of Tamim Iqbal but the in-form opener was confident of taking part from the onset.

The four-nation regional tournament will open with the defending champions Sri Lanka taking on Pakistan in the opening match.

The Tigers are up against India in their first game on June 16, then they take on Sri Lanka on June 18 and three days later, Bangladesh face Pakistan.

All the matches will be played in Dambulla.

# Usha might be relegated!

Usha Krira Chakra, defending champions of the Premier Division hockey league could be facing relegation as punishment for not turning up for the opening match of the Green Delta Insurance Premier Division Hockey League against Police AC yesterday.

The Old Dhaka powerhouse opted to skip the current league after receiving a letter from Bangladesh Hockey Federation, which declared Mohammedan winners of the Club Cup that ended in farcical circumstances earlier in March.

Usha KC had taken part in the Club Cup final against Mohammedan while protesting at the same time the opponents' decision to field an unregistered foreign player. The high-ups of the game's governing body interfered to convince both sides to take part in the final in presence of the Finance Minister. The game ended 15 minutes before the scheduled time due to poor light with Mohammedan declared champions as they were leading 2-1 at the time. Usha immediately made their grievances known as they did not receive runners up medallion and lodged a complain with the league committee to take action according to bylaws.

The League Committee with a majority con-

sensus made a recommendation to the BHF working committee in its last meeting to abandon the Club Cup citing Mohammedan's claim that they did not receive any copy of the bylaws of the tournament throughout the tournament.

But, BHF ignored league committee's recommendation and did not even sit for reviewing the recommendation.

"Three days ago, I talked to the federation president and he took full responsibility for declaring Mohammedan winners," BHF general secretary Khondokar Jamiluddin said, "If we make any change to the decision of the Club Cup final match, then it will dishonour a senior minister of the government, who witnessed the match and distributed prizes."

Jamil also said that the complaint lodged by Usha was not valid since it was not submitted properly and also informed that Usha would now be relegated in line with bylaws for skipping the match.

Jamil also said that they had apologised to Usha for the mistakes made during the farcical final of the club cup and expected Usha to accept the result in greater interest of hockey.

However, Usha KC general secretary and BHF joint secretary Abdur Rashid Shikdar has expressed his disbelief at receiving the letter from Bangladesh Hockey Federation that declared Mohammedan winners of the Club Cup.
