# Villagers remove sleepers demanding 'just price'

About 500 villagers from different upazilas of Tangail removed 18 cement-made sleepers near the newly constructed railway station at Hemnagar in Gopalpur

upazila yesterday noon demanding 'just price' for their land that had been acquired for the rail track.

Being informed, Gopalpur upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) Suraiya Begum along with a police team rushed to the

spot and brought the situation under control.

The UNO told this correspondent that she held a talk with the angry villagers and assured them of placing their demand to the authorities concerned.

Earlier on 24 May last, the villagers had formed a human chain at the railway station demanding just prices of their lands and gave an ultimatum in this regard.

About 15,000 families of Gopalpur, Bhuapur and Kalihati upazilas in Tangail did not get just prices of their lands acquired 12 years ago for the Tarakandi-Bangabandhu Bridge Railway Link Project.

Bangladesh Railway on 1997-1998 financial years took up the Tarakandi-Bangabandhu Bridge Railway Link Project to make a rail link between greater Mymensingh and northern region.

The project was aimed at making cheaper and easy transportation of urea fertiliser from the Jamuna Fertiliser Company in Jamalpur to different districts of the country.

Land acquire for the project was started in 2000 and a total 667 acres of lands were acquired in 32 mouzas under Gopalpur, Bhuapur and Kalihati upazilas to construct the 27-kilometre railway track and two railway stations.

The villagers, however, did not accept the low prices offered to them against the acquired lands, said Abdur Rashid, a villager of Bhuapur upazila.

SUICIDE BY SCHOOLGIRL PARUL RANI

## Eight accused out of 10 still at large

Police are yet to arrest eight of the ten accused in the case filed with Assassuni Police Station, accusing them of compelling a schoolgirl to commit suicide on June 3.

Though police arrested two accused—Amaresh Kumar Mondol and Samir Kumar Mondol after filing of the case, the remaining eight, including the prime accused, are still at large.

They are Billal Hossain, Priyonkar Mondol, Hasan, Swapan Gain, Paritosh Gain, Devdual Mondol, Habibullah and Prabir Mondol of Khajra village under Assassuni upazila. Billal and Priyonkar are the prime accused in the case.

Parul Rani Mondal, a class ten student of at Khajra High School, who fell in love with Priyonkar Gain of the same village, committed

suicide being deceived by her fiancé on June 3.

Victim's father Ranjan Kumar Mondol filed the case with Assassuni upazila on the night of June 4.

Billal Hossain and his accomplices stalked Parul while she was going to her school on May 25 and at one stage Billal kissed her. The matter was resolved at arbitration and village headman fined Billal Tk 4,000 for his misdeed.

As Priyonkar later refused to marry Parul, she committed suicide by taking poison at their house on the night of June 3.

Officer-in-Charge of Assassuni Police Station Fazul Rahman said Parul took her life being failed to get recognition of her love. He said Priyonkar, Billal and six other accused had gone into hiding soon after the incident. Police drive continues to arrest the culprits, the OC added.

## Soccer fans in 3 dists go on rampage

Soccer fans went on the rampage in Naogaon, Rajshahi and Joypurhat districts on Saturday night as power outage interrupted watching on television the World Cup match between Argentina and Nigeria.

In Naogaon, angry soccer fans torched Palli Biddyt Samity's (PBS) area office at Sapahar at around 8:30pm and damaged furniture and official documents

Md Rezaul Haque, general manager of Naogaon PBS, said the mob set official documents and a motorbike afire. On information, fire fighters from Patnitala upazila rushed to the spot and extinguished the blaze.

Locals alleged that power supply in Sapahar area remained off since morning and soccer fans became angry as PBS failed to restore power supply even during

the match between Argentina and Nigeria.

In Rajshahi, soccer fans barricaded Rajshahi-Dhaka highway at Puthia as power outage began minutes after beginning of the Argentina-Nigeria match.

Locals beat up PBS officials Rezanur Rahman and engineer Shahanur Rahman at Atrai upazila headquarters and ransacked the PBS area office on Saturday night protesting power outage during the World Cup matches.

They damaged at least five vehicles and besieged the house of local PBS area office in-charge Moniruzzaman. As police went to the scene, the angry people had an altercation with the law enforcers.

The situation became normal when power supply resumed in the area. Reports of demonstrations were also received from Manda upazila of Naogaon and Joypurhat district.

Our Jhenidah correspondent reported that an Argentine supporter was electrocuted at Mohamhmadpur village under Shaikupa upazila while repairing an electric wire on Saturday night.

The deceased was identified as Moshir Rahman, 25, son of Daud Kha.

Local said Moshir was electrocuted as he was repairing an electric wire during the World Cup match between Argentina and Nigeria at around 9:30pm.

## Man murdered by sister-in-law in Pirojpur

A man, who was stabbed by his sister-in-law on Friday afternoon over a trifling matter at Charpukuria village in Sadar upazila, died at Khulna Medical College Hospital late at night.

The deceased was identified as Forkan Sikder, 38, of the village.

Police quoting locals people said, Forkan's nephew Kamrul quarrel with his son Sohel on Friday noon. At one stage Forkan slapped both of them for quarreling over a trifling matter.

After that Minara Begum, being angered for slapping her son Kamrul hit Forkan with a sharp weapon, leaving him critically injured.

Locals admitted Forkan to Sadar Hospital and as his condition deteriorated he was shifted to Khulna Medical College Hospital where he died at 3am.

### Shops gutted, 5 hurt

At least five people were injured and 11 shops gutted yesterday in a fire near Merry Cinema hall under Kotalipara upazila of the district. Officer-in-Charge of Kotalipara police station Ferdous Hossain said, the fire originated from an electric short circuit at a tea stall near the hall and soon engulfed the adjacent shops. After a frantic effort for one and a half hours, the locals were able to douse the blaze, which left five of them injured. The injured were rushed to the local health complex. The fire also damaged property worth Tk 30 Lakh, victims claimed.

### Robbers kill one

A man was stabbed to death by robbers at Kornikanda village in Bhanga upazila of Faridpur early yesterday. The deceased was identified as Mizanur Rahman, 45, of the village. Officer-in-charge of Bhanga police station Rafiqul Islam said a gang of 4 to 5 robbers entered three houses at around 2:00am. They hit Mizanur with a sharp weapon as he chased the robbers when they were leaving the place with the booty. Mizanur died on the spot. On information, police recovered the body from a jute field in the morning.

### Arms seized, 2 held

Police yesterday arrested two arms peddlers and recovered two foreign-made pistols and nine bullets near Eidgah area of the city. The arrestees were identified as Anik Hossain Feroj, 26, son of Abdul Khalek of Savar upazila of Dhaka and Sherul Banerjee Dcosta, son of Shamol D'costa of Gouronadi upazila of Barisal district. Officer-in-charge of Fatullah model police station Jibon Kanti Sarker said when police were patrolling near the Eidgah area early yesterday they saw a rickshaw was running faster apparently to flee the scene. At this police stopped the rickshaw and searched the two passengers and recovered two pistols and nine bullets from their possession.

### Drug peddlers held
